


GENERAL INFORMATION

ORIGIN OF THE NAME

- Delaware Indian language: "mountains and valleys alternating", "large plains"
- Munsee language: "at the big river flat"
- Algonquin language: "a large prairie place"



Nickname: Equality State Motto: Equal Rights

RIDICULOUS LAWS




