

# Confusing WORDS

# advice

**Advice** is a noun, which means an opinion that someone offers you about what you should do. **It's always singular.**

*For example: I need someone to give me some **advice**.*








# advise

**Advise** is a verb, which means to give information and suggest types of action.

*For example: I **advise** everybody to be nice to their teacher.*

# all

Use all when you think about people or things as a whole. It's followed by a plural verb.

For example: All of my shoes are worn out.

# each

Use each when you think about people or things in a group separately. It's more usual for a small number. It's followed by a singular verb.

For example: She had a bottle in each hand.











# every

Use every when you think about the whole group of people or things together. It's more usual for a large number. It's followed by a singular verb.

For example: Every student was given a prize.

# alone

**Alone** means without other people or on your own.

For example: *He likes living **alone**.*

# lonely

**Lonely** means you are unhappy because you are not with other people.

For example: *The house feels **lonely** now that all the children have left home.*
