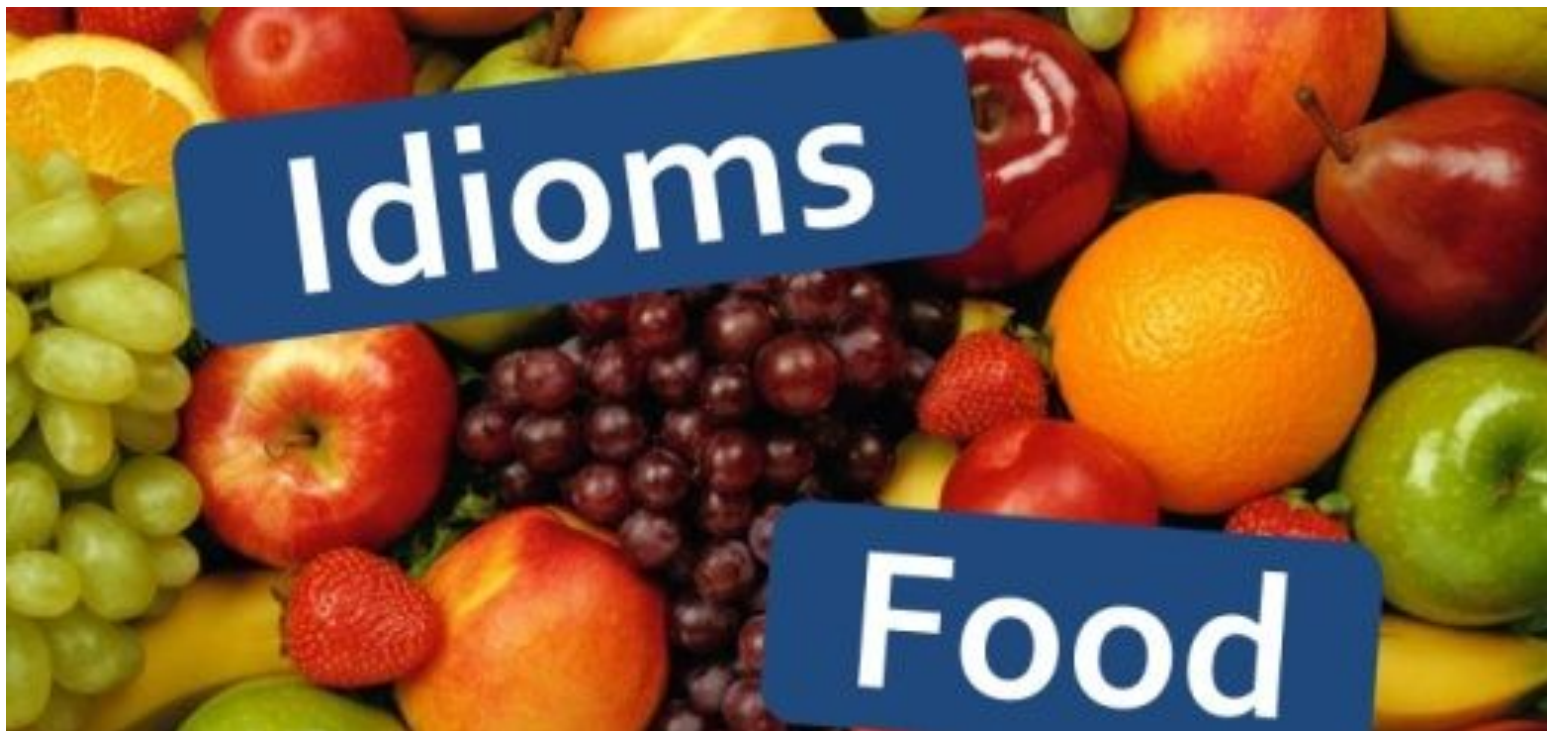
Idioms and sayings about food

- Today we're going to learn some English idioms and sayings about food. Idioms are difficult to learn because the meaning of an idiom is different to the individual meaning of each word in the idiom!

idiom N a group of words that have a different meaning when used together from the one they have when used separately

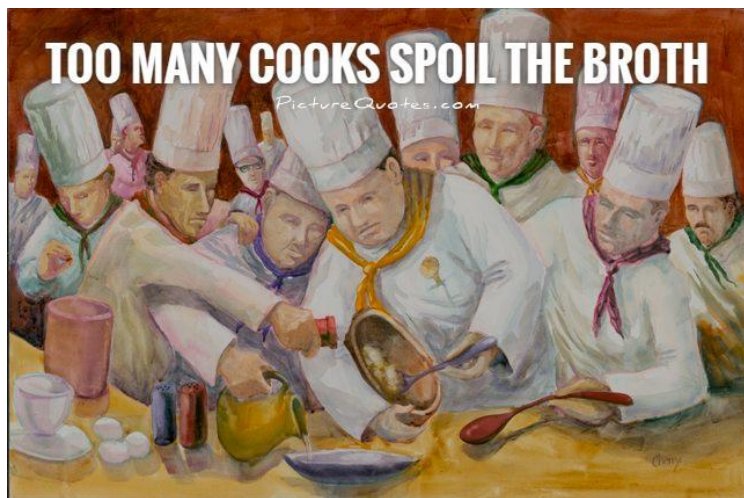
saying N a sentence that people often say and that gives advice or information about human life and experience

Egg Idioms

bad egg – плохой человек
good egg – хороший человек
have egg on one's face – быть смущенным
put all one's eggs in one basket – рисковать всем
walk on eggs – быть очень осторожным
you can't make an omelette without breaking the eggs – невозможно что-то сделать без последствий

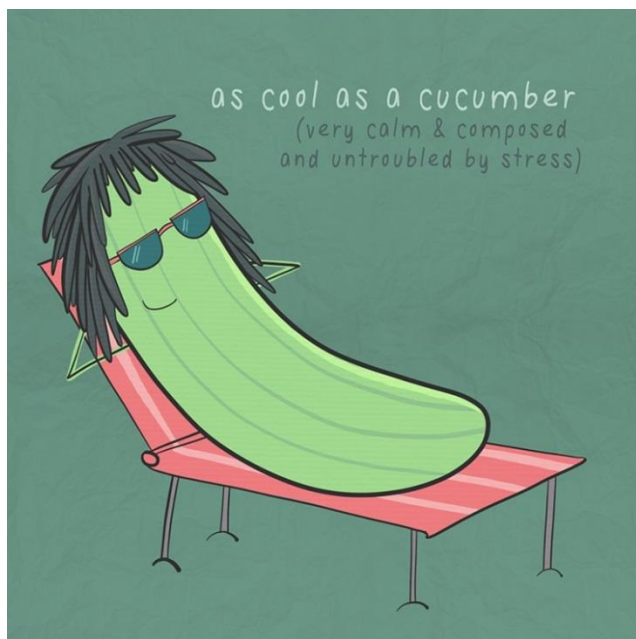




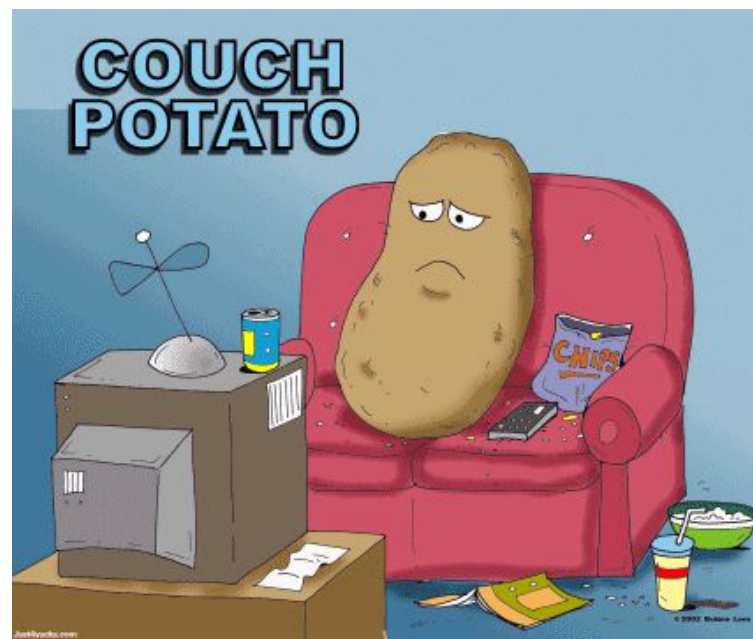

Lemon law

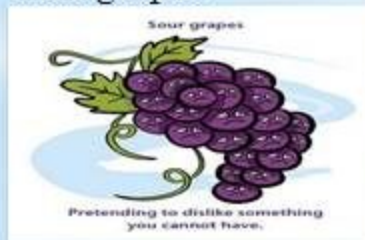


A law that requires manufacturers to replace, repair, or refund the cost of vehicles that prove to be defective.

ЛИМОННЫЙ ЗАКОН (гарантируют покупателям возврат денег за товары, которые не соответствуют заявленному качеству)

Automobile Lemon Law of this state is designed to protect the consumers from unsafe and defective new cars.

Sour grapes



Refers to an attitude in which someone adopts a negative attitude to something because they cannot have it themselves

She said she didn't want to join the club anyway, but I bet it was clearly sour grapes.

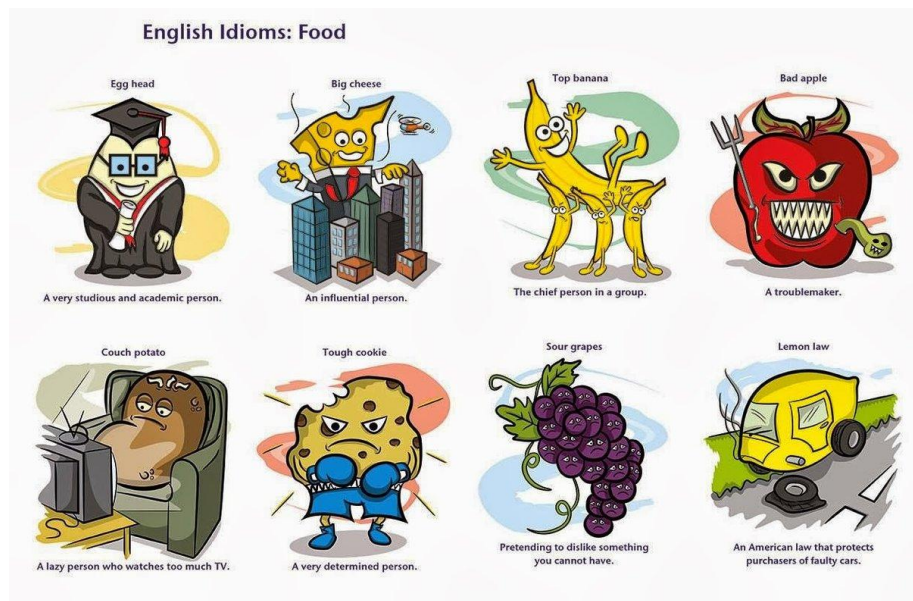
Look at the example.
