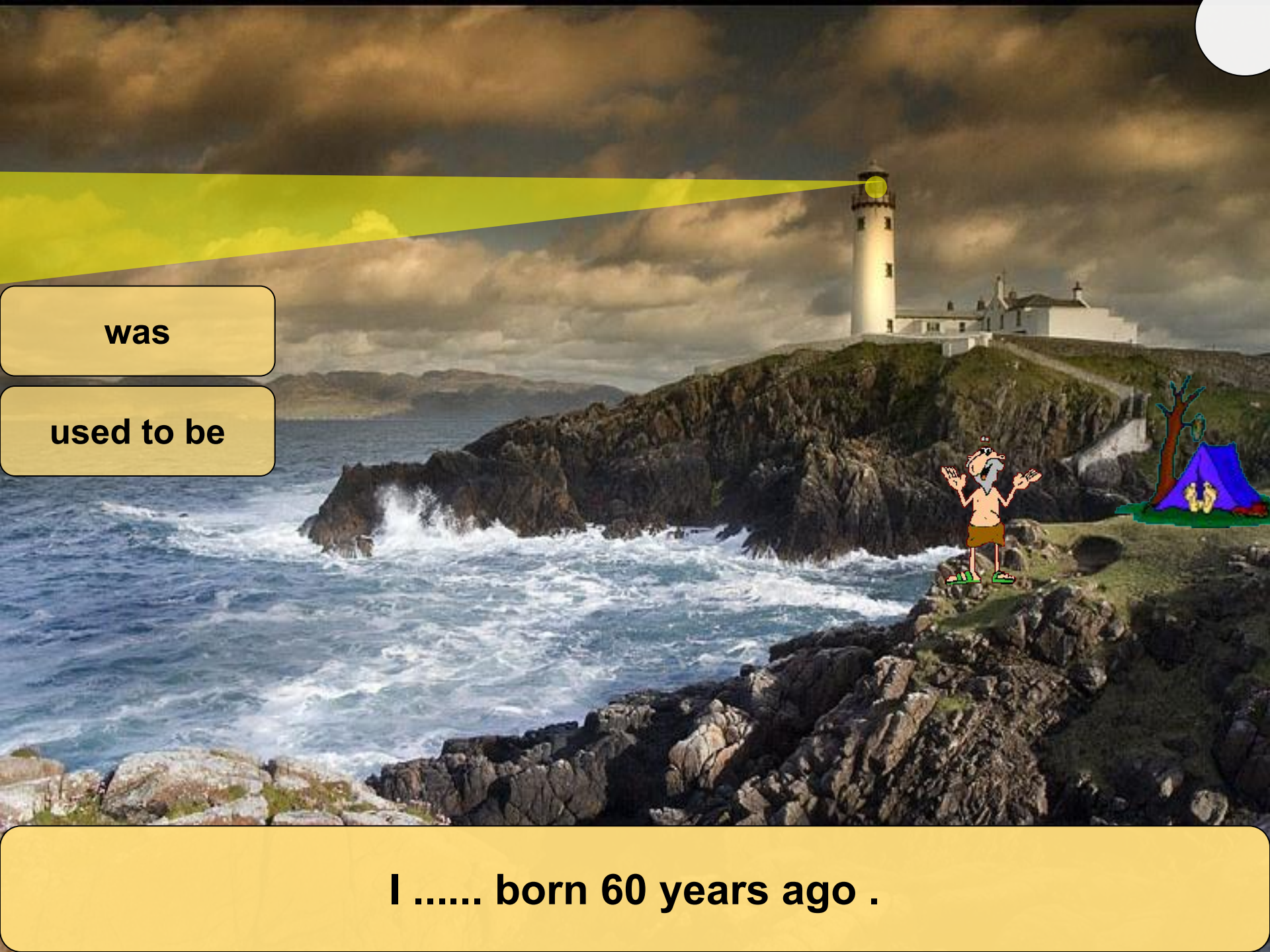

used to meet


One evening I ...Kate. She was 4 years older than me.

(or state)
that no longer occurs at the moment of speaking.**

For example:

**When I was young, I used to run 5 miles a day
but now I just walk.(activity)**

**He used to be fat when he was a boy but now
he weights only 60 kilos.(state)**
