

- Возвратные местоимения употребляются в предложении, для того чтобы сказать, что лицо предмет названный подлежащим:
- а) сам совершает действие;
- б) сам совершает действие и испытывает его на себе.
- I wash the dishes myself.
- I wash myself.







### If you feel exhausted, you should lie down and get some rest.




### I have a toothache.
