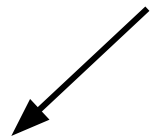

Student can take a professional paid internship program (12 to 29 months) to gain professional experience, than change the visa status or return home

Visa Policy

Student have only 2 to 4 months to change the visa status after graduation



On campus only: student center, bookstore, cafeteria
(to work off-campus you will have to apply for a Curricular Practical Training)

Work during studying

Off-campus: 20 hours a week part-time or full-time during holidays
