Future Simple

will/won't V₁



He thinks he

We use will to make predictions about the future based on what we think or imagine.
 We often begin our sentence with the words: I think, I'm sure, I believe.
 I think life will be very different in 2100.

First conditional

- We use the present simple after if and when, not the future simple.
- if/when + present simple
 If/When | go to Spain, | will take lots of photographs.

NOT: If/When I will go to Spain,

- If ____+ don't/doesn't V , ___ will/won't V_1 .
