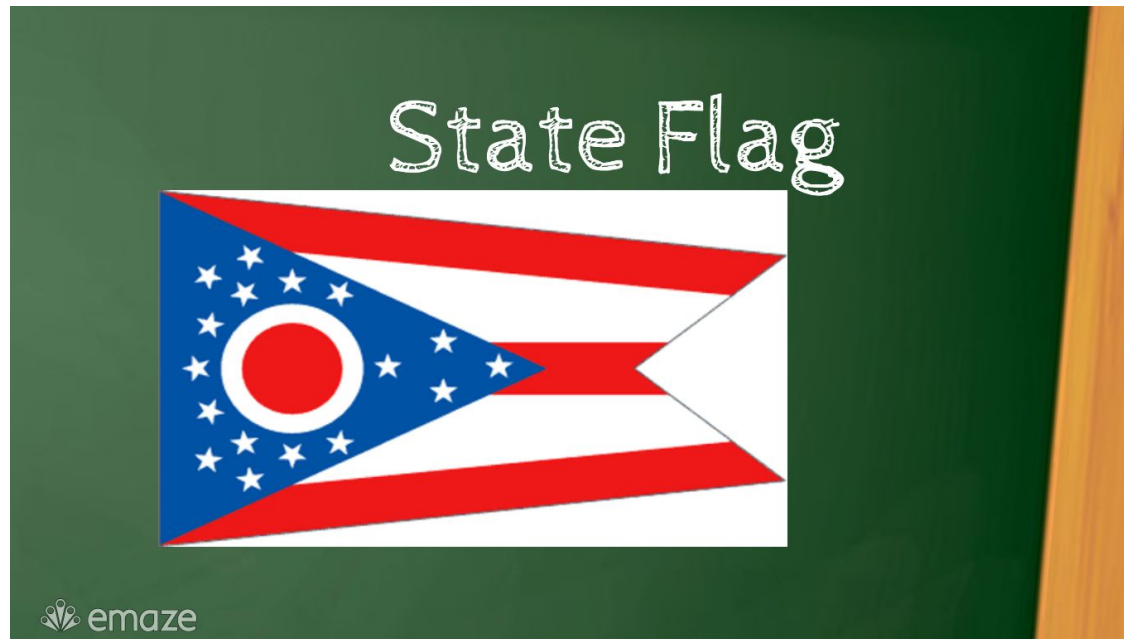

- ▶ admitted to the Union on March 1, 1803
- ▶ was the first post-colonial free state admitted to the union

Ohioan culture has been influenced by German American migrants who started to settle in the state in the mid-1800s. They brought a Midland dialect to Ohio, which originated in **Pennsylvania** and is still spoken today. Ohio is often referenced as the epitome of American suburban culture. Ohioans are known as courteous and polite people.

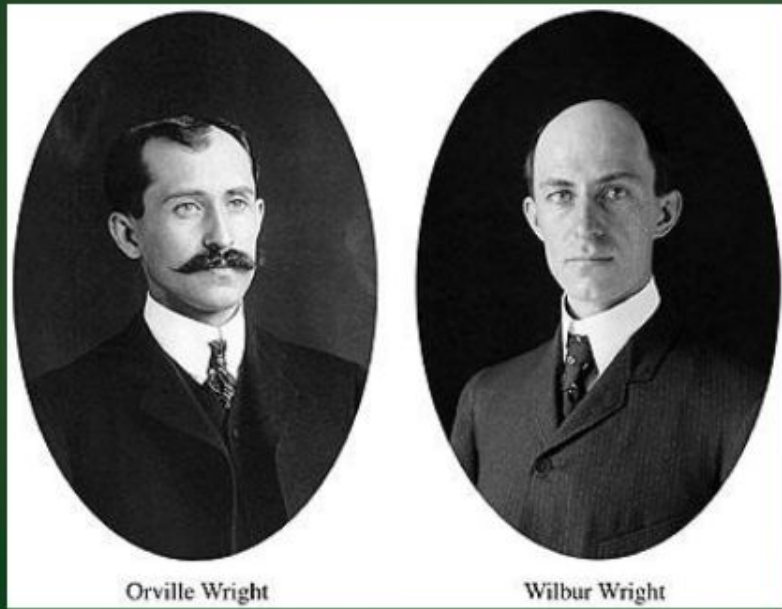
5. Famous people of the state

He is the only American inventor to have 1,000 patents. His most famous invention is the lightbulb.

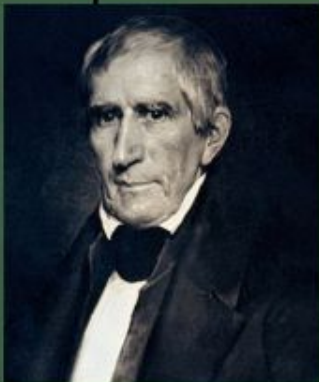
John Glenn was the first American to orbit the Earth. He was born in Cambridge, Ohio.

Ulysses S. Grant

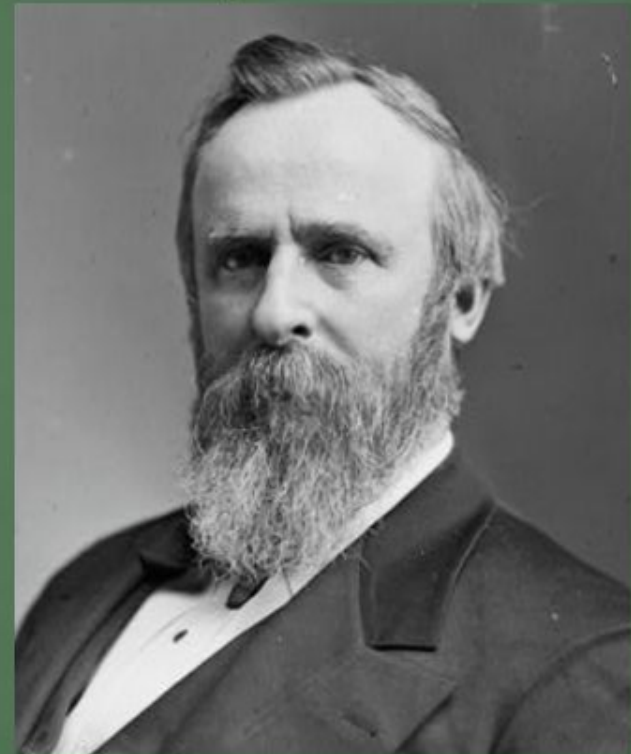
He was the 18th president. He was in office from 1869 until 1877.

He was born in Point Pleasant, Ohio.



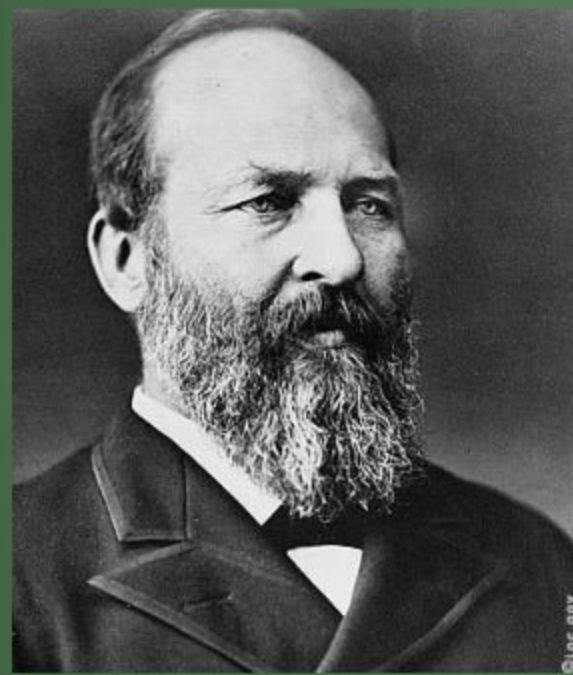
Rutherford B. Hayes

The state motto is "With God, all things are possible."

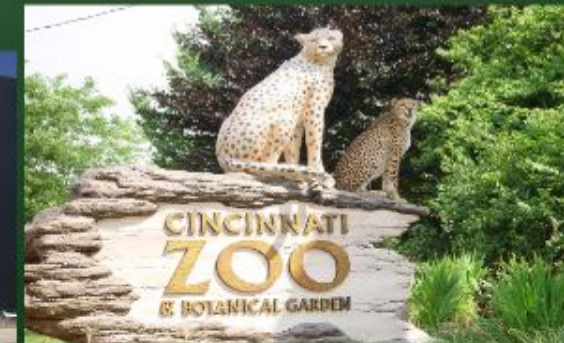
The state tree is the aesculus glabra.
