 Wellington - New Zealand capital, the second most populous city in the country, the capital of the largest countries in Oceania and the southernmost capital city in the world.



Wellington has had several nicknames: Capital-bay (Eng. The Harbour Capital), Vellivud (born Wellywood = Wellington + Hollywood) and the Windy City (English Windy City). For one week in November 2012, Wellington was officially renamed the Middle-of-the-Middle-effects (Middle of Middle-earth, that is, "The middle of Middle-earth").



 Wellington city is divided into five administrative regions - North (Northern Ward), Lambton (Lambton Ward), South (Southern Ward), East (Eastern Ward) and West Onslow (Onslow-Western Ward) and 57 microdistrict.



The city has 102 parks and recreation and entertainment. Wellington Square is 289.9 km²




According to the 2007 population of the urban area of Wellington was about 460,000 people




