Verb	Noun
to protect	protection
to pollute	pollution
to predict	prediction
to destroy	destruction
to explore	exploration
to attract	attraction

“Subject”

- A **verbal noun** does not take a subject in the nominative case.
- A noun in the **accusative case** can function as the subject of the verbal element.
 - Δεῖ **αὐτήν** ἐσθίειν.
- When an infinitive has two accusatives, the first is usually the “subject”
 - Δεῖ βλέπειν **αὐτόν** **αὐτήν**.

The verbal noun had the endings:

- The Old English

-ung

- The Middle English

-ing(e)

The Modern
English

- ing

The Gerund and the Verbal Noun

The Gerund

- has voice and correlation distinctions;
- can function as a direct object;
- can have adverbs as modifiers.

The Verbal Noun

- has the plural form;
- functions in of-phrases;
- combines with adjectival attributes;
- has the article.
