Are you excited about the climb?

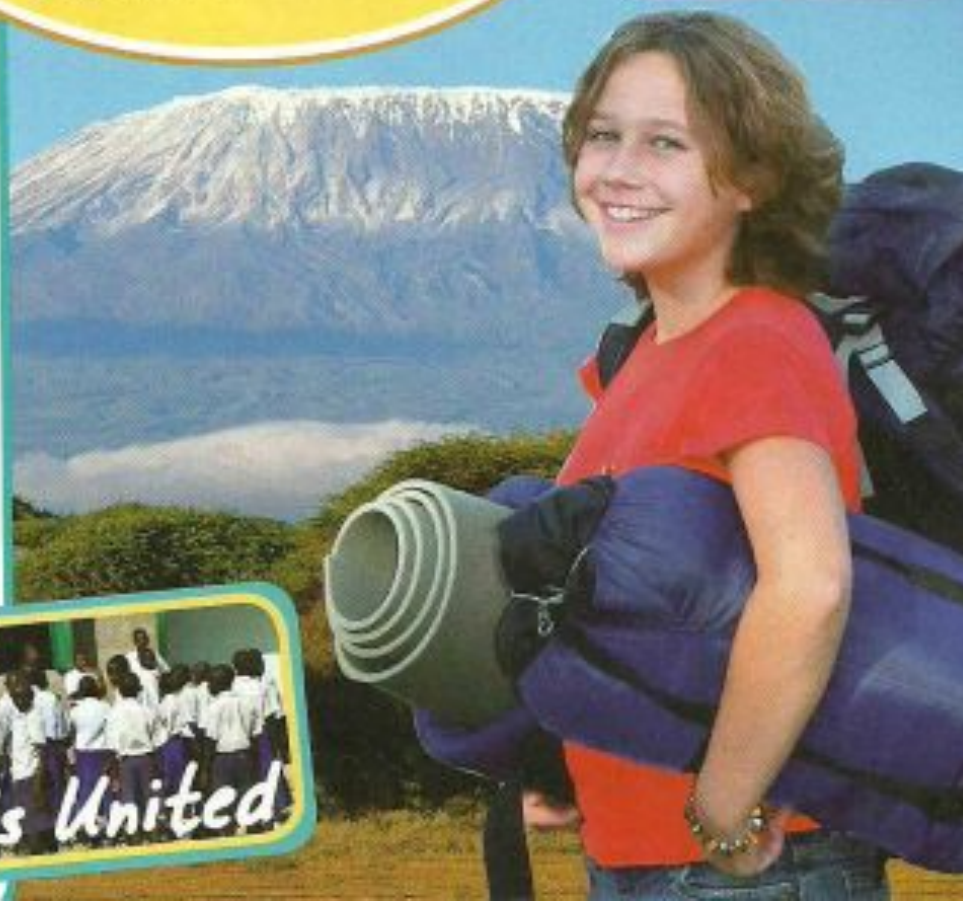
Yes, I am, but it isn't going to be easy. We're going to walk 85 kilometres in seven days!
