Reasoning

- Begin with a fundamental truth
- Cause-effect analysis
- Several reasons
- «Even if» technique
- Never exaggerate
- An example is not the reason

Impacting

- Group of people (first of all the most important group, usually the most vulnerable groups such as poor people, minorities, etc.)
- Different groups - different impact
- Detailed analysis (Как именно они страдают/получают удовольствие)

Comparative

- Analysis of alternative ways
- Uniqueness of benefits/harms
- How does it work on their side of the house?
- Should include impacting
- Comparative with the best scenario on their side of the house

Criteria

- How strongly does it impact
- Possibility of it taking place
- Number of agents
- Uniqueness
