## Have got: affirmative and negative



We use **have got** to talk about possession.  
*I've got a red pen. They haven't got a computer.*

Affirmative	
Full form	Short form
I have got	I've got
you have got	you've got
he has got she has got it has got	he's got she's got it's got
we have got	we've got
you have got	you've got
they have got	they've got

Negative	
Full form	Short form
I have not got	I haven't got
you have not got	you haven't got
he has not got she has not got it has not got	he hasn't got she hasn't got it hasn't got
we have not got	we haven't got
you have not got	you haven't got
they have not got	they haven't got

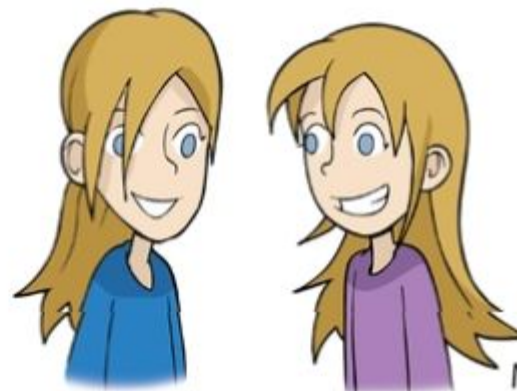
