Человек и природа: экологическая история. Под общ. ред. Д. Александрова, Ф.-Й. Брюггемайера, Ю. Лайус. СПб.: Алетей, 2008. 349 с.

Сборник впервые предлагает вниманию отечественных читателей лучшие образцы исследований в области экологической истории — нового, быстро развивающегося направления современных исторических исследований, изучающего историю взаимоотношений человека и природы. Экологическая история возникла в 1970-е годы на волне общественного интереса к проблемам окружающей среды и охраны природы; с тех пор экологические историки питают надежду помочь экологам, вскрывая исторические причины современных экологических проблем. Но в первую очередь экологическая история — это новаторское интеллектуальное предприятие, призванное расширить границы понимания как роли природы в развитии человеческой цивилизации, так и места и роли цивилизации в жизни нашей планеты. Настоящий сборник это наглядно демонстрирует. В книгу вошли широко известные в мире работы выдающихся экологических историков США и Германии:

Джона Мак-Нипла, Уильяма Крона, Альфреда Кросби, Дугласа Винера, Джеймса Скотта, Франца-Йозефа Брюггемайера, Клей Мак-Шейн и Джоела Тарра. Все публикуемые статьи выходят на русском языке впервые.



Йоахим Радкау. Природа и власть. Всемирная история окружающей среды. М.: Издательский дом Высшей школы экономики, 2014. 472 с.

Взаимоотношения человека и природы не так давно стали темой исследований профессиональных историков. Для современного специалиста экологическая история (environmental history) ассоциируется прежде всего с американской наукой. Тем интереснее представить читателю книгу «Природа и власть» Йоахима Радкау, профессора Билефельдского университета, впервые изданную на немецком языке в 2000 г. Это первая попытка немецкоговорящего автора интерпретировать всемирную историю окружающей среды. Й. Радкау в своей книге путешествует по самым разным эпохам и ландшафтам — от «водных республик» Венеции и Голландии до рисоводческих террас Китая и Бали, встречается с самыми разными фигурами — от первобытных охотников до современных специалистов по помощи странам третьего мира. Красной нитью через всю книгу проходит мысль, что вопрос окружающей среды — это всегда

вопрос власти. Смысловым центром книги является раздел «Вода, лес и власть». Не менее важна мысль, что «природа» — не только что-то внешнее по отношению к человеку, но и значительная часть его самого. История экологии, по мнению автора, — это история менталитетов. Особая ценность книги состоит в гигантском охвате использованной литературы — проанализированы не только ведущие труды известных зарубежных специалистов XX века, но и реакция на них.



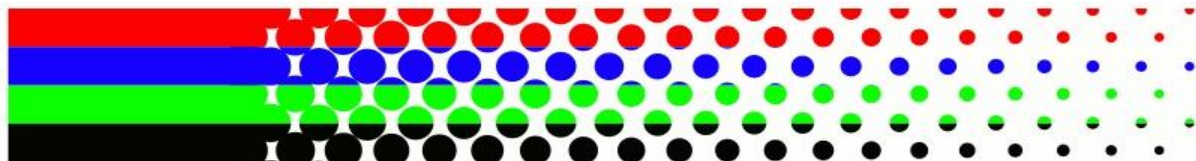

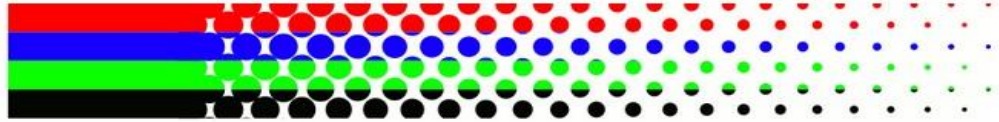

The deadline for panel submissions is **15 October 2016**. That for individual papers is **31 January 2017**.

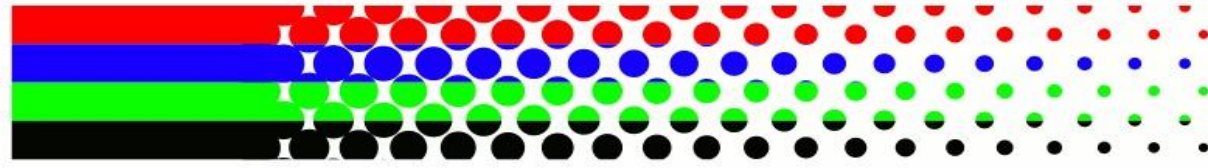

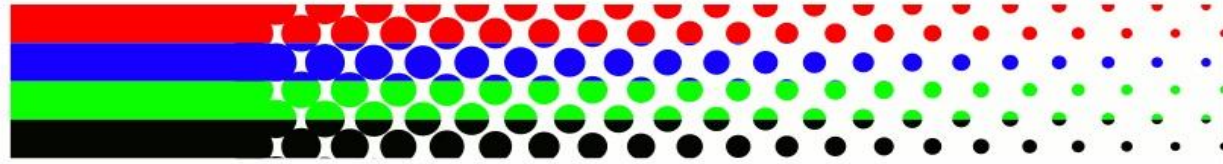

featured scholarship

Andrew Needham's book *Power Lines: Phoenix and the Making of the Modern Southwest* (Princeton University Press, 2015) explains how inexpensive electricity became a requirement for modern life in Phoenix—driving assembly lines and cooling the oppressive heat. Navajo officials initially hoped energy development would improve their lands too, but as ash piles marked their landscape, air pollution filled the skies, and almost half of Navajo households remained without electricity, many Navajos came to view power lines as a sign of their subordination in the Southwest. Drawing together urban, environmental, and American Indian history, Needham demonstrates how power lines created unequal connections between distant landscapes and how environmental changes associated with suburbanization reached far beyond the metropolitan frontier. Needham also offers a new account of postwar inequality, arguing that residents of the metropolitan periphery suffered similar patterns of marginalization as those faced in America's inner cities. His book was selected as ASEH's best book in 2016.

You and your research (brief description)

Before moving to York in 2012, David held posts at universities in the north of England and west of Scotland, but began his career at the University of Texas at Austin. His postgraduate studies included a year at Leningrad State University in 1985-6. He has held fellowships and visiting positions in the USA, Russia and Finland. The main focus of his research has been the rural world of the Russian Empire from the seventeenth to the twentieth centuries. Initially a social historian, he moved into environmental history over a decade ago. His work has become increasingly transnational and comparative. His research on the steppes has led him to explore parallels and connections with America's Great Plains. He has also been involved in collaborative research projects on environmental history in Britain. He is lead investigator on the Leverhulme International Network: 'Exploring Russia's Environmental History and Natural Resources', involving specialists from UK, US and Russian universities, which entails annual field trips to key locations in Russia and Ukraine.

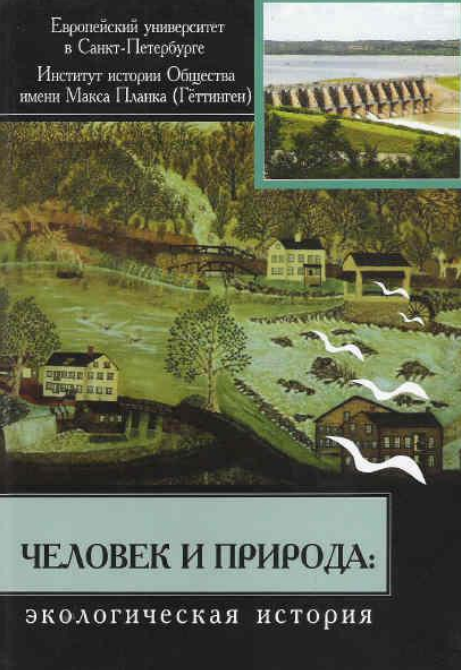

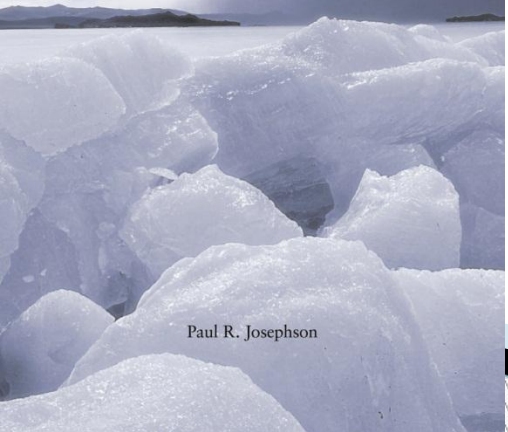
