The structure of the article

1. Write an introduction (a lead)

This paragraph - usually one or two sentences - must be a brief summary of the main purpose of the article, which answers the basic questions of "who, what, when, where, how and why."

2. Explore your topic in paragraphs

The first paragraph must be more important than the second, and the second paragraph more important than the third and so on.

3. Read over the article body and where necessary, **provide it with arguments**
