be + V₃

Страдательный залог — лингв. грам. форма **залога**, показывающая, что лицо или предмет, выступающие в предложении в роли подлежащего, не производят действия (не являются его субъектом), а испытывают на себе чье-либо действие (являются его объектом).

am / is / are + V₃
- The Past Simple Passive
was / were + V₃
- The Future Simple Passive
will / shall + be + V₃

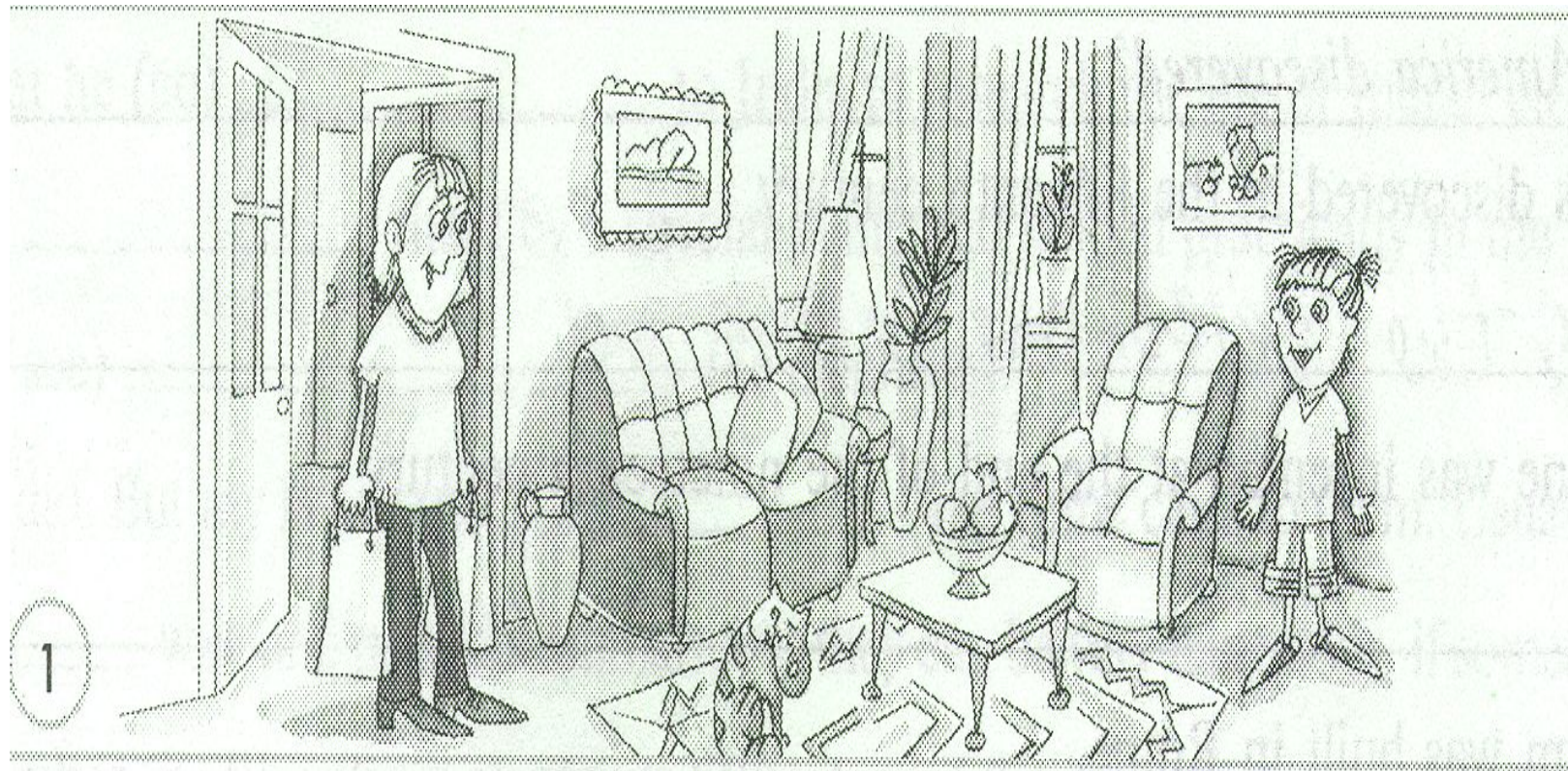

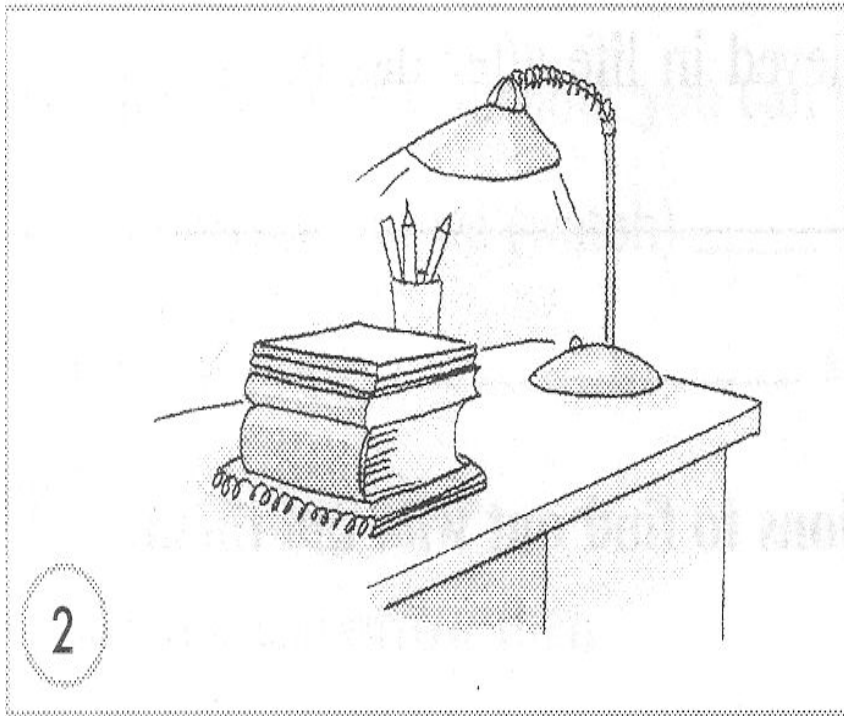
Was / were + V₃

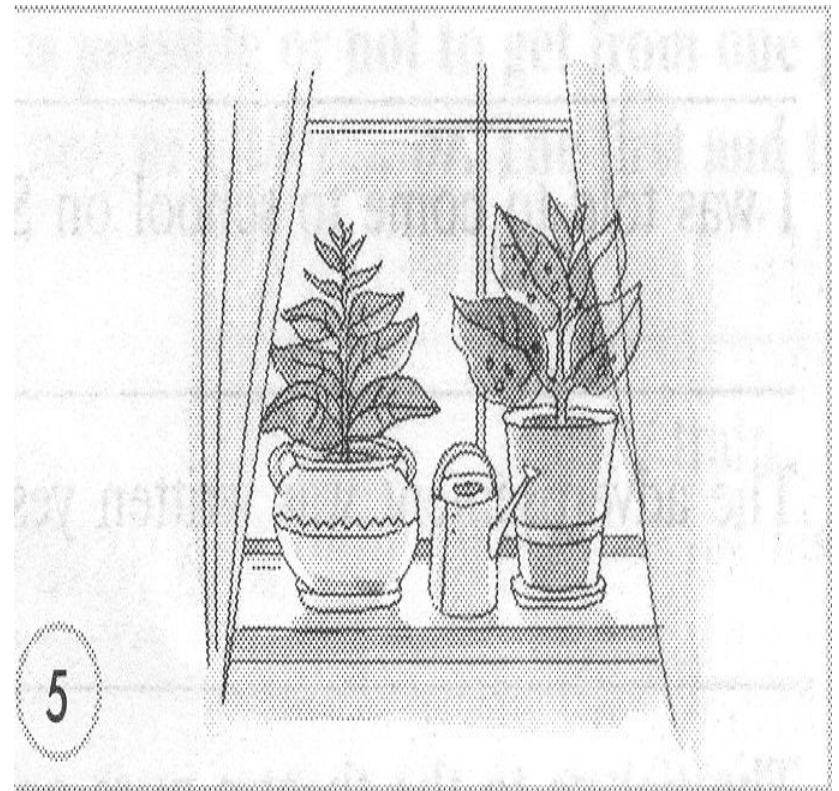

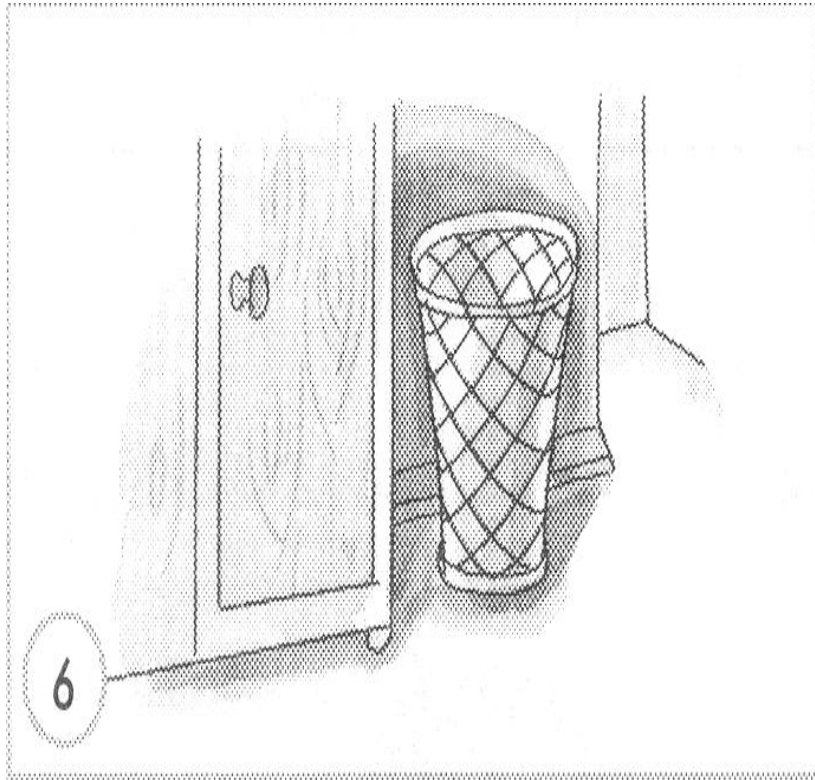


dishes / to wash

Was / were + V₃

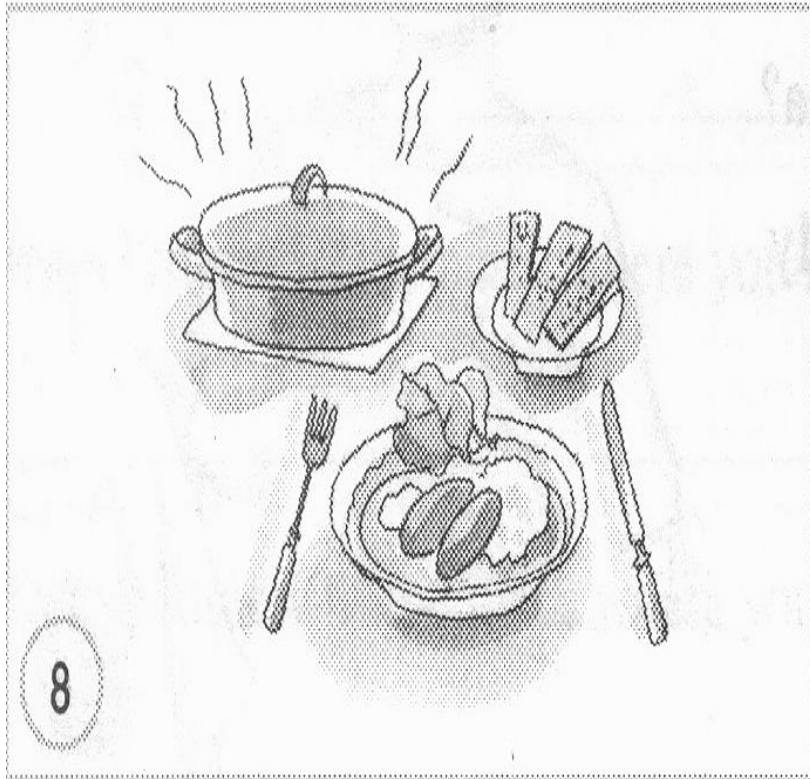


rubbish / to take away

Was / were + V₃

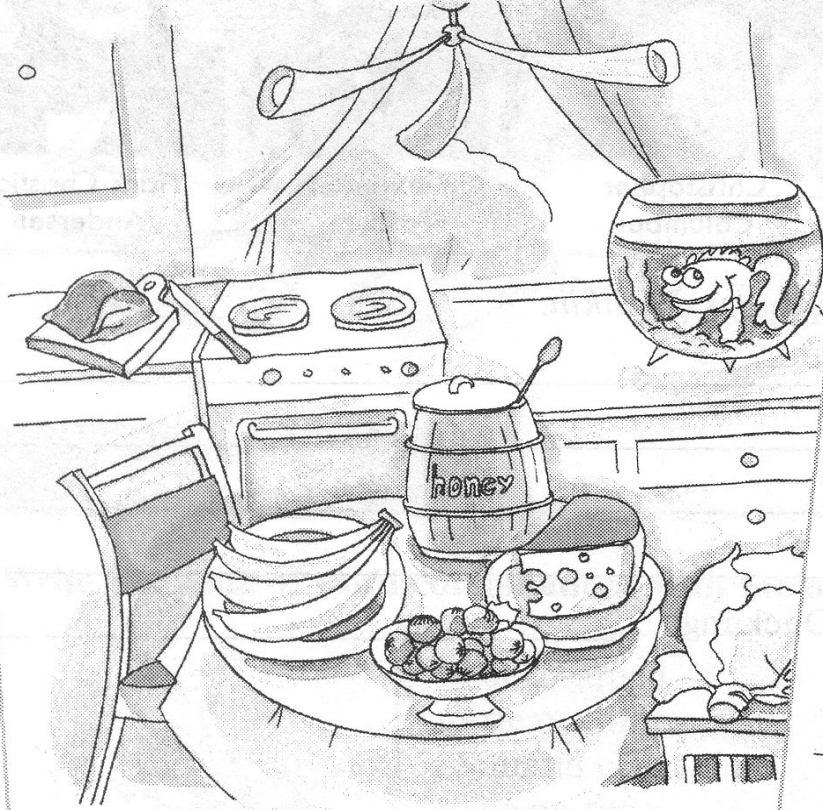


supper / to cook

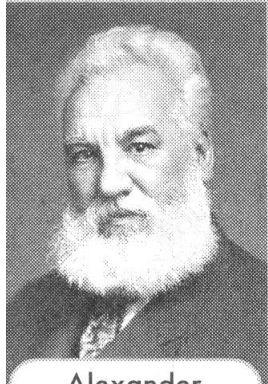

Shall / will be V3
