Ben looks at the picture again. 'Is it a cow?' he asks.

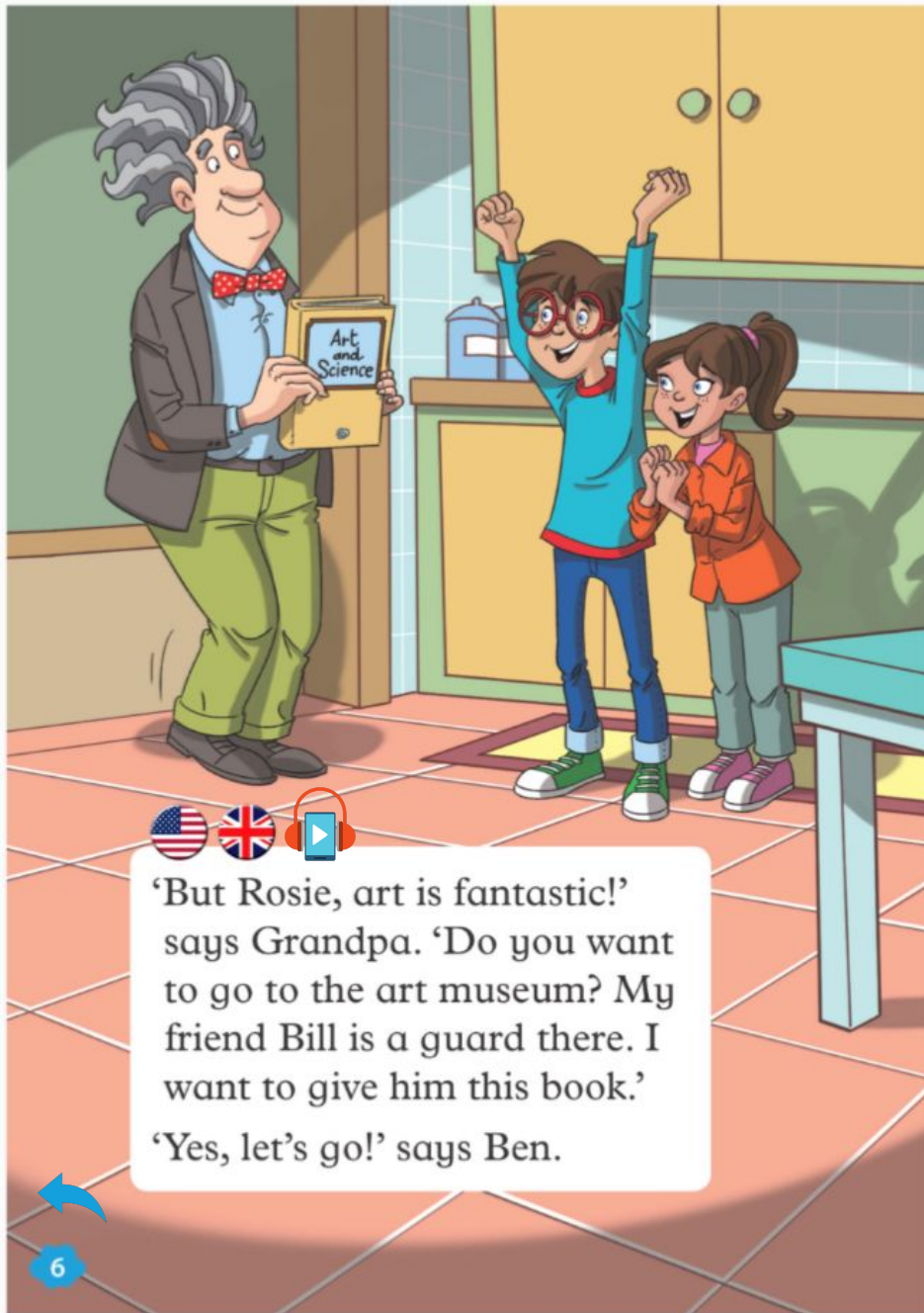
'No!' says Rosie. 'It's a cat!'
