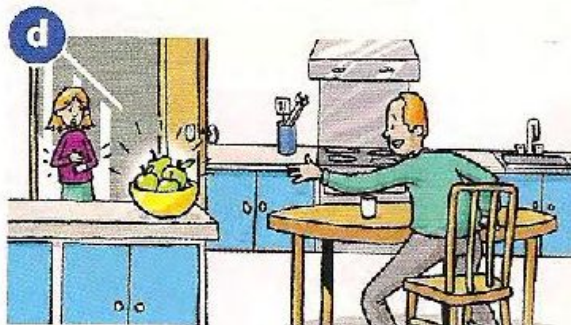

My grandfather says, "Look, Edith. These are my ice skates. They were in the entryway."





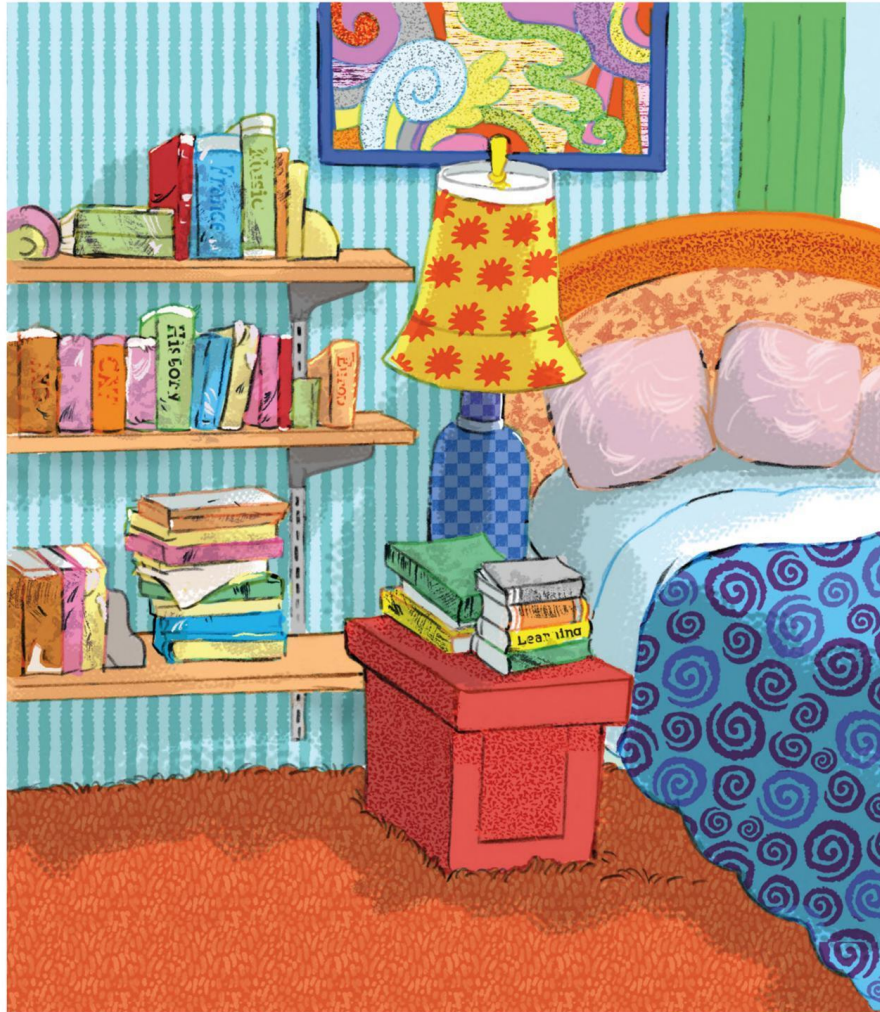
“Where are the ice skates now, Grandpa?” I ask.
He says, “They’re in that box on the shelf.”

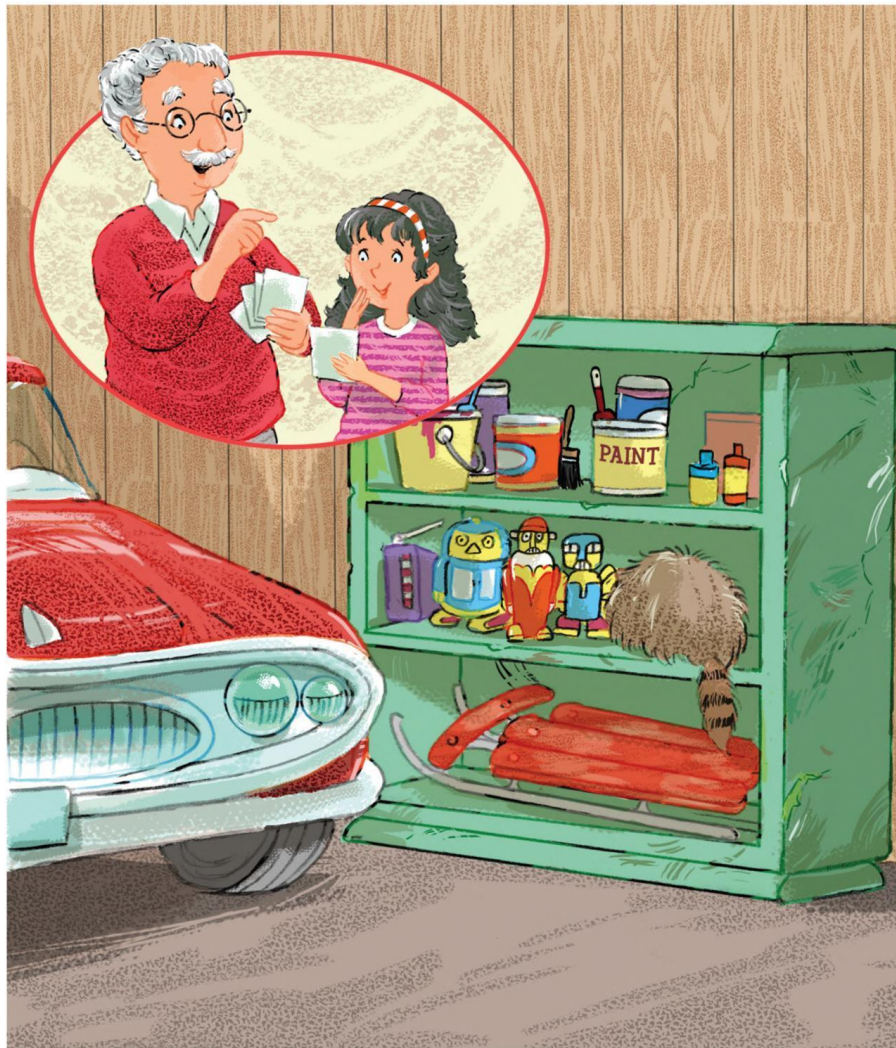


My grandfather says, "Look at this picture, Edith. My books were on a bookshelf. The bookshelf was in the living room."

books at night.”

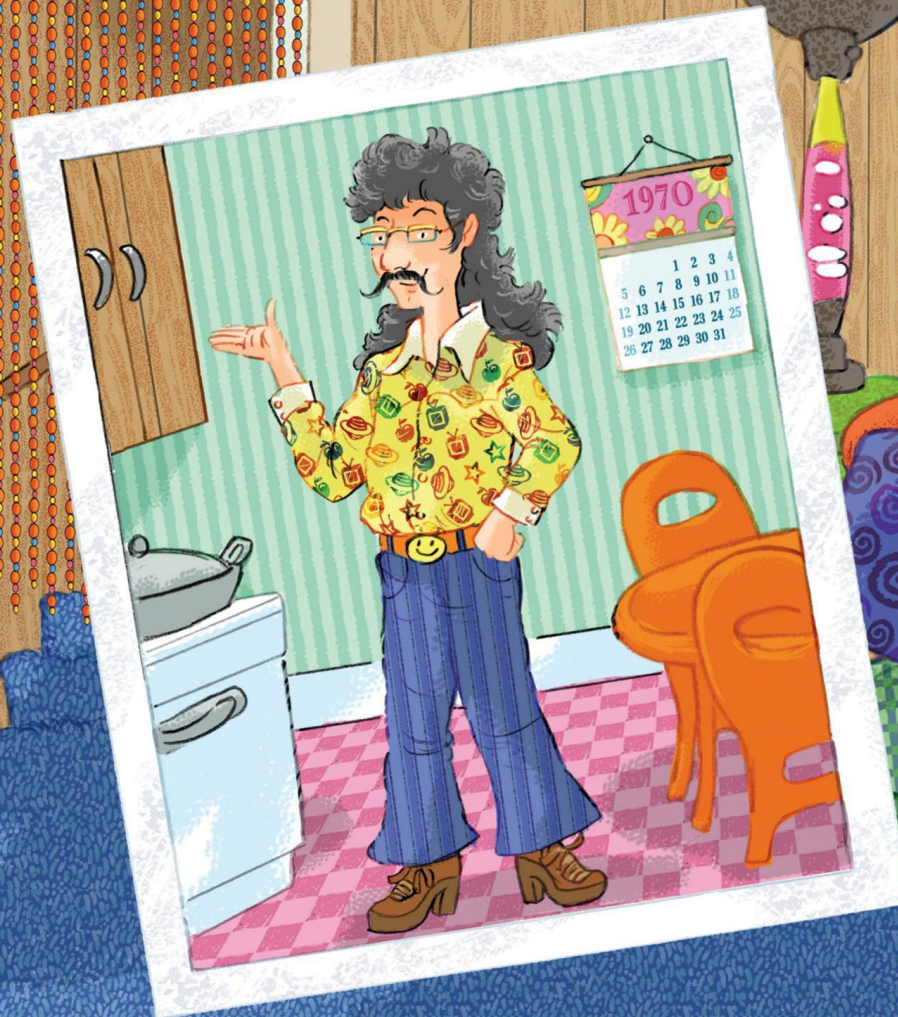




“Where is the bookshelf now?” I ask.

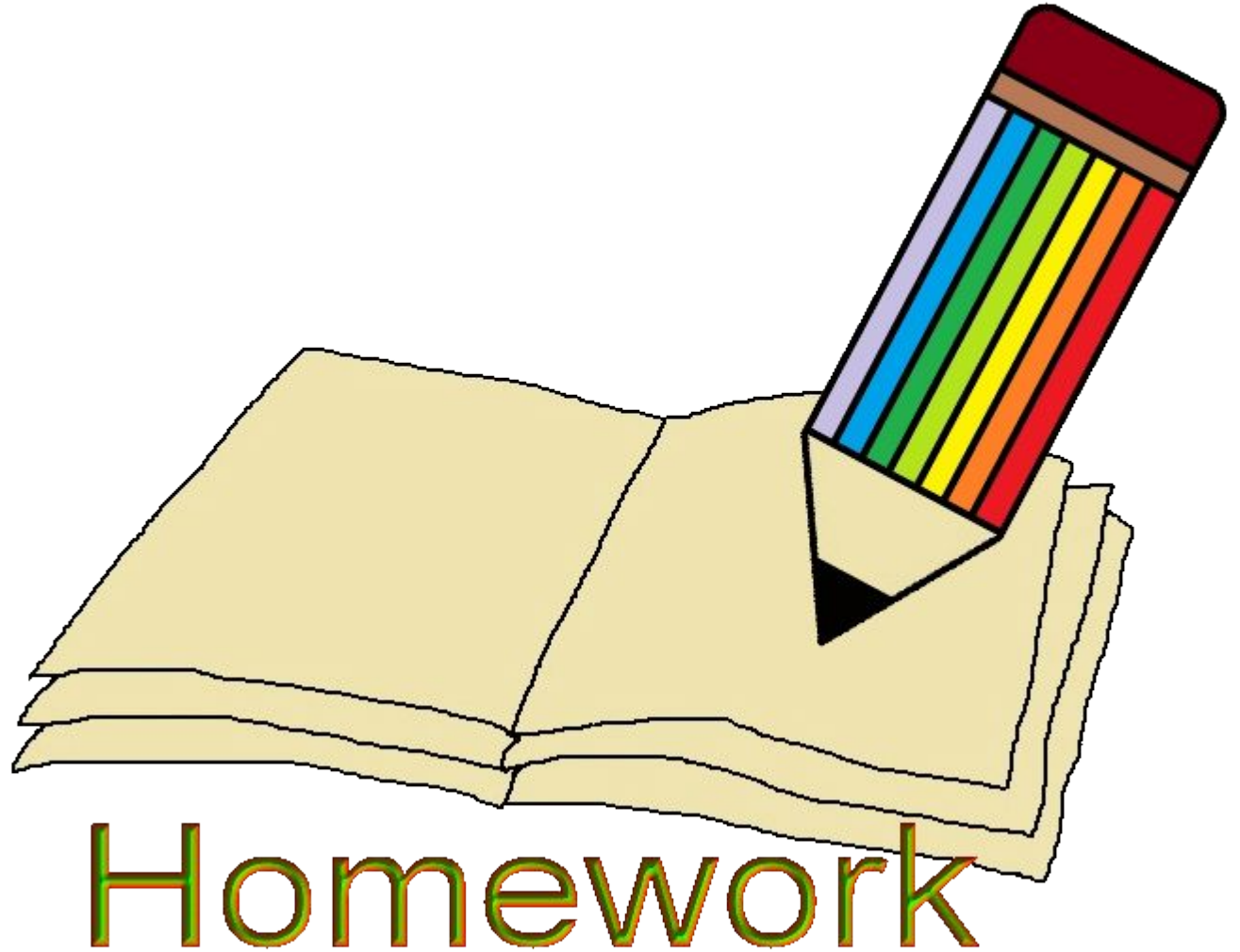
“It’s in the garage, Edith,” he says. “My old sled is on the first **shelf**. My old toys are on the second shelf.”


“Look, Grandpa. You were in the kitchen.

He says, “I’m in the basement!”




