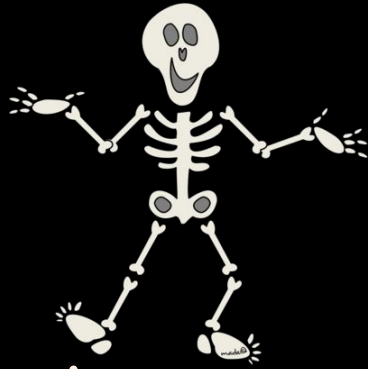




On October 31st, we

One Halloween party game is called 'bobbing for apples'. Apples are put in a big bowl full of water. The players, sometimes blindfolded must take an apple out of the water without using their hands.



JACK-O- LANTERN



Jack-o-lanterns are hollowed out pumpkins with a face cut in one side and a candle put inside. In the old days people lit fires to scare away bad spirits. They believed light had power over darkness. Today Jack-o-lanterns are supposed to frighten away ghosts and witches.

On Halloween, when it was believed that bad spirits came back to the earthly world, people thought they would meet ghosts if they left their homes.





To avoid being recognized by ghosts people would wear masks when they left homes after dark so that the ghosts would mistake them for fellow spirits. That's why Halloween costumes are traditionally monsters such as vampires, ghosts, witches and devils.

Children in costumes go from house to house in their neighbourhood, often in small groups, in order to ask for treats such as sweets, lollipops, chocolates or money.
