PRESENT CONTINUOUS TENSE



NEGATIVE



I' m not cooking
You aren't cooking
He isn't cooking
She isn't cooking
It isn't cooking
We aren't cooking
You aren't cooking
They aren't cooking

PRESENT CONTINUOUS TENSE



INTERROGATIVE



Am I cooking?
Are you cooking?
Is he cooking?
Is she cooking?
Is it cooking?
Are we cooking?
Are you cooking?
Are they cooking?
