TENNIS CHAMP ASHE HAS AIDS

TENNIS legend Arthur Ashe has AIDS, it was revealed last night.

The former Wimbledon champion contracted the virus from blood to his glove during a heart operation 15 years ago, a spokesman for the 46-year-old former world number one announced in an interview in New York.

ASHE was diagnosed last year and has been taking the drug AZT in an attempt to hold the virus at bay.

The star in 1976, when he 33 was a Grand Slam champion, is one of the many 1,000 people in America who have contracted the virus through tainted blood.

Ashe, married with a 12-year-old daughter, revealed the problem to his former coach, who said that Jimmy Connors is one of the many people given at risk.

The former tennis player is set to be in the United States before a heart attack in 1976.

He was 33 at the time.

Ashe, son of a Virginia politician, had his eye for the year.
