QUBI's dog has been right as opinion polls showed they were heading for a shake-out with Labour.

A Glasgow poll for today's Sunday Telegraph puts the Tories on 28.5 per cent, Labour 36 and the Liberal Democrats 35.

John Major's team also had a 5.5 lead in the same survey last week.

Labour are on 28 in a March poll for The Times - just the point ahead of the Tories after having a seven-point lead last week.

As it is poll for The Guardian shows Labour and Tories both on 28 points, with the Lib Dems on 31.

The same poll last week showed Labour 36 and Tories 28.

TENNIS CHAMP ASHE HAS AIDS

TENNIS legend Arthur Ashe has AIDS, it was revealed last night.

The former Wimbledon champ contracted the virus after being tested in his gym during a heart operation 15 years ago.

Ashe, 44, underwent the operation because he was having trouble before winning his Wimbledon title and 1975 Wimbledon through a heart condition.

Ashe was diagnosed last year and has been taking the drug AZT in an attempt to hold the virus at bay.

The star is from the US and is one of a small number of people in America who have contracted the virus through transfused blood.

Ashe, married with a 12-year-old daughter, revealed the problem to his former partner, who died last year. He had Jimmy Connors to win the men's singles title at Wimbledon.

The former tennis star is one of the 100,000 people in the US who are infected with the virus.

Ashe, 44, was one of a Virginia politician, had his eye for the year.
