TENNIS CHAMP ASHE HAS AIDS

TENNIS legend Arthur Ashe has AIDS, it was revealed last night.

The former Wimbledon champ contracted the virus after being exposed to the virus during a heart operation 15 years ago.

John, 44, underwent coronary bypass surgery before announcing his condition to his wife and AIDS activists through his lawyers.

Star

Ashe was diagnosed with the virus last year and has been taking the drug AZT in an attempt to hold the virus at bay.

The star - born in 1942 into a Grand Old Party household - is one of nearly 1,000 people in America with death sentences through tainted blood.

Ashe, married with a two-year-old daughter, coached the prince and the career of his wife, the first lady, in 1973.

He was 34 and had AIDS at the time.

John, son of a Virginia politician, had his eye for the prize.
