



About the university



The Medical University of Vienna is a public university located in Vienna, Austria.

As one of the oldest medical schools in the world, it is the oldest in the German-speaking countries, and was the second medical faculty in the Holy Roman Empire.

The Medical University of Vienna is the largest medical organisation in Austria, as well as one of the top-level research institutions in Europe and provides Europe's largest hospital, the Vienna General Hospital, with all of its medical staff.

Founder



- The University of Vienna was founded by Rudolf IV, Duke of Austria, in March 1365.

The Josephinum was built between 1783 and 1785 for the Academy of Medicine and Surgery, and shows numerous wax models of the human body.

A centre for patient care in eastern Austria, Vienna's university hospital deserves its reputation for providing comprehensive, high quality tertiary medical care. Transplantation medicine is a stand-out feature of the university's broad portfolio of outstanding achievements and the hospital is one of the leading centres worldwide for organ transplants. Its 120 lungtransplants, for example, make Vienna's General Hospital the third largest centre in the field worldwide.

- Hans Fischer Nobel Prize in Chemistry. Awarded for "for his researches into the constitution of haemin and chlorophyll and especially for his synthesis of haemin"
