Directions

Objective: To reinforce and review recognizing high and low sounds.
Grade Level: Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten, First and Second Grade

This is a "read only" document so only intended icons may be selected. When you close the document **do not save**. **Save the product to your computer/files before accessing the sounds and animations. You will need to be in "slide show" presentation mode for the animations and sound effects to be available.** Since students have to click on objects I have turned off the "advance to next slide on mouse click" on any slide the students will be accessing. I did not want them to leave the page if they accidentally clicked. The option "advance slide on mouse click" can be found under the transitions tab. **Please note** if you are using a Smartboard you are able to use the PowerPoint exactly like you would a Smartboard document – touch the board to have the animations and sound effects occur! You might have to turn off the "Smart-Ink Layer" to access sounds and hyperlinks.

Using a mouse or the touch pad on a computer have a student click/press on the kite to listen to a sound. Click/press again if needed. If you are using a Smartboard and need to touch multiple times to listen to the sound it works better if you touch in a different spot each time.



High Low

The student should use the mouse or touch pad on the computer and click on the **word** that represents the sound. If the student clicks on the correct word – he/she will know immediately if they are correct when the kite flies.

If the student clicks on the wrong word there will be an "Oops - listen again". The student should press on the kite to listen to the sound again before proceeding. Once the correct answer is selected then click on the arrow to proceed to the next slide.



Click on the back arrow to access the previous page.



Click on the rewind button to return to the title page.



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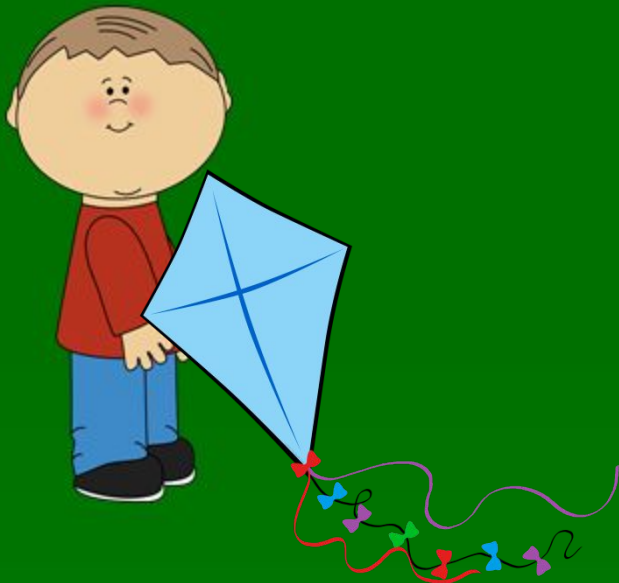
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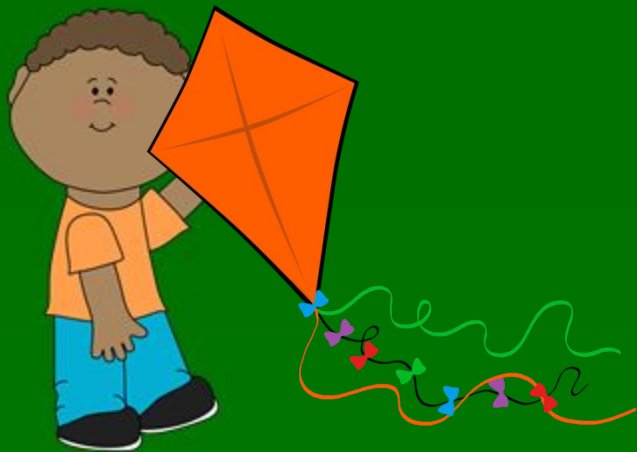
