bring fetch deliver

- I'm going to **bring** an umbrella with me.
I would like to **bring** my friends to the party.
- She opened the safe to **fetch** her passport and money.
- The man **fetches** a chair for that woman
- The letter was **delivered** two weeks ago
- These documents should be **delivered** to the main office

A **journey** from London to Paris can now be completed in under 3 hours.

I've had two **journeys** to London.

My boss has gone on the business **trip** to South America.

Let's go on a **trip** to the mountains this summer!

The idea of going on a sea **voyage** fascinated him.

The Titanic sank on his maiden **voyage**.



excursion tour expedition

We went on an **excursion** to the Pyramids.

The students were given a **tour** of the White House.

They went on a guided **tour** of the museum.

The **expedition** started in western New York.

The **expedition** was preparing to march on El Obeid.

Word formation: –ness, -ment

- adjective + ness =
Noun

DRY + NESS = DRYNESS

LAZY + NESS = LAZINESS

KIND+ NESS = KINDNESS

BITTER + NESS =
BITTERNESS

- verb + ment = noun

to ADVERTISE+ MENT =
ADVERTISEMENT

to AGREE + MENT =
AGREEMENT =

to AMAZE + MENT =
AMAZEMENT

to ANNOUNCE + MENT =
ANNOUNCEMENT =
