« Did you have (you/have) a nice time? »

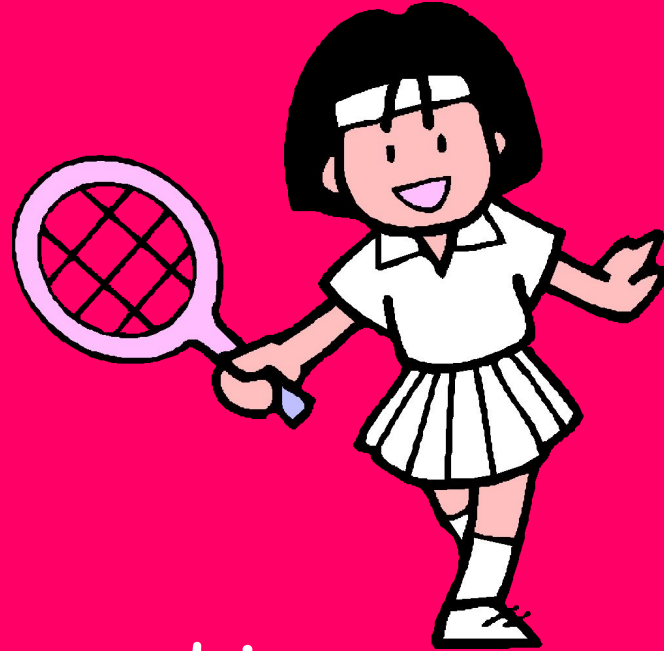
« Yes, we did, we stayed (stay) with friends. »

« What if it rains (rain) what will you do (do) then? »

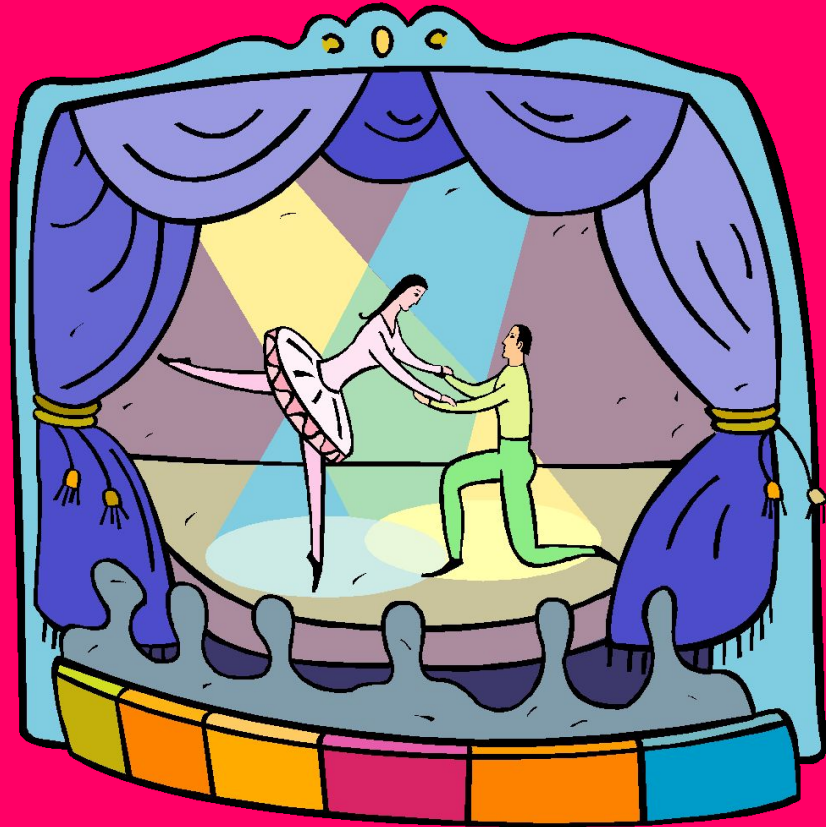
« I 'll go (go) to the cinema perhaps. »

Put the verbs into the correct tenses



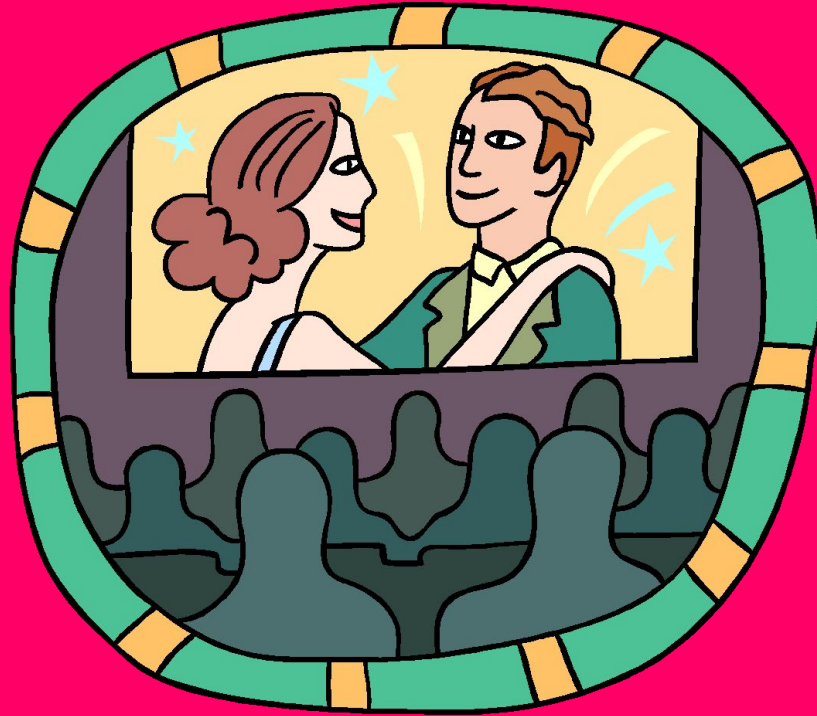
Betty was sitting (sit) on the balcony when

Put the verbs into the correct tenses



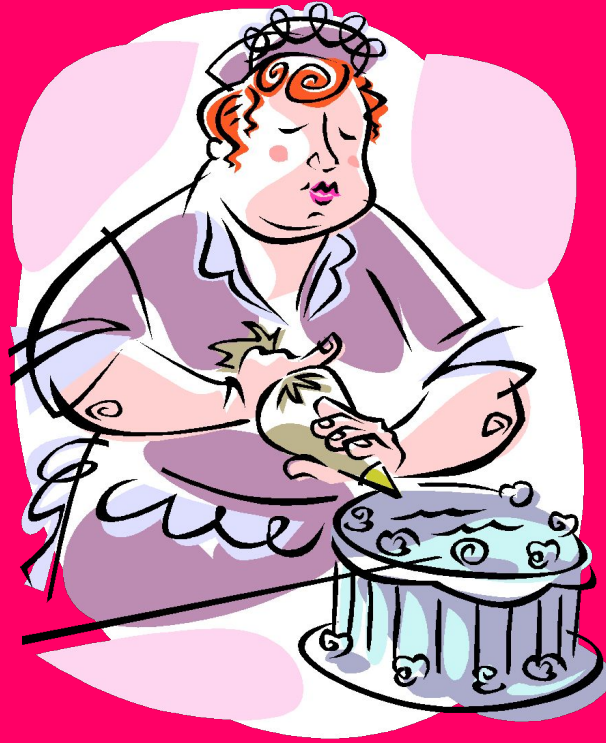
« When was the house built (the house/build)? »
