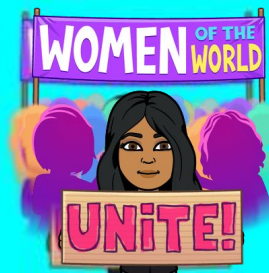

### Marie Curie

Marie Curie was a Polish physicist, chemist, and biologist. She discovered radioactivity. She was the first woman professor at the University of Paris. She was also the first woman to win a Nobel Prize and the only person to win 2 Nobel Prizes, one in physics, in 1903, and the other in chemistry in 1911.

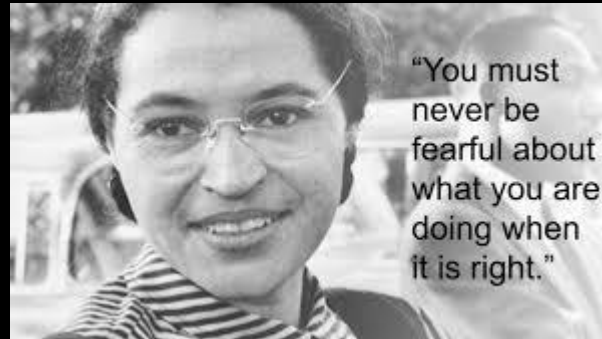


# Rosa Parks

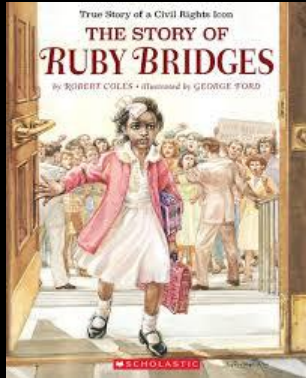

# Ruby Bridges

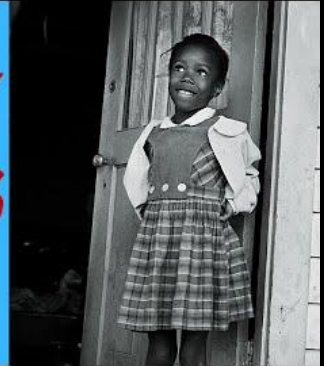

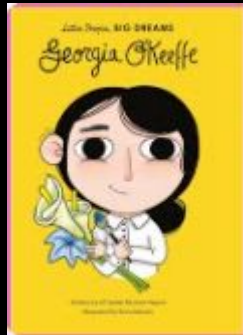

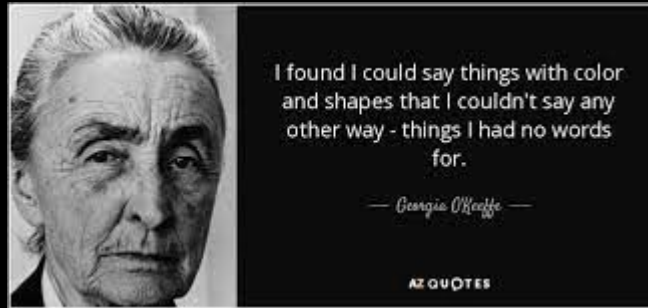


# Georgia O'Keeffe

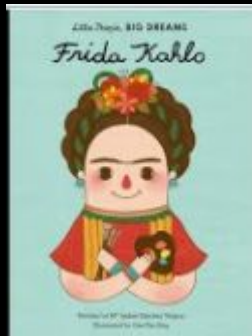

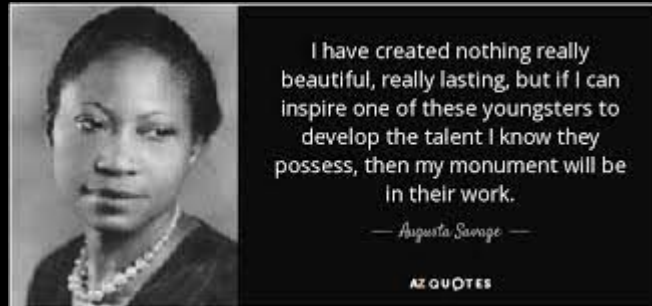


# Augusta Savage
