Not only this one but also the other



• They were hungry! They ate both the cake and the pie.



• One or the other of two, but not both.



 Her brother is either Paul or Tim. I'm not sure.

## neither ... nor...

- Not this one and not the other.
- Used with an affirmative verb.



They played neither football nor tennis.
They just read stories.

## Let's practice:

- I want <u>neither</u> water <u>nor</u> soda. I'm not thirsty.
- You can choose: we can go <u>either</u> to the French restaurant <u>or</u> to the pizza place.
- I'm very sad. <u>Neither Pat nor</u> Andy came to the party.

- <u>Both</u> Chicago <u>and</u> New York are important American cities.
- Their new car is <u>either</u> black <u>or</u> red. I don't remember very well.
- Poor Charles. He broke both his left leg and his right arm in the accident.
