As you know, the Thames is one of the main British rivers, you can hear about it from tourists and locals, as well as find various references in the literature.



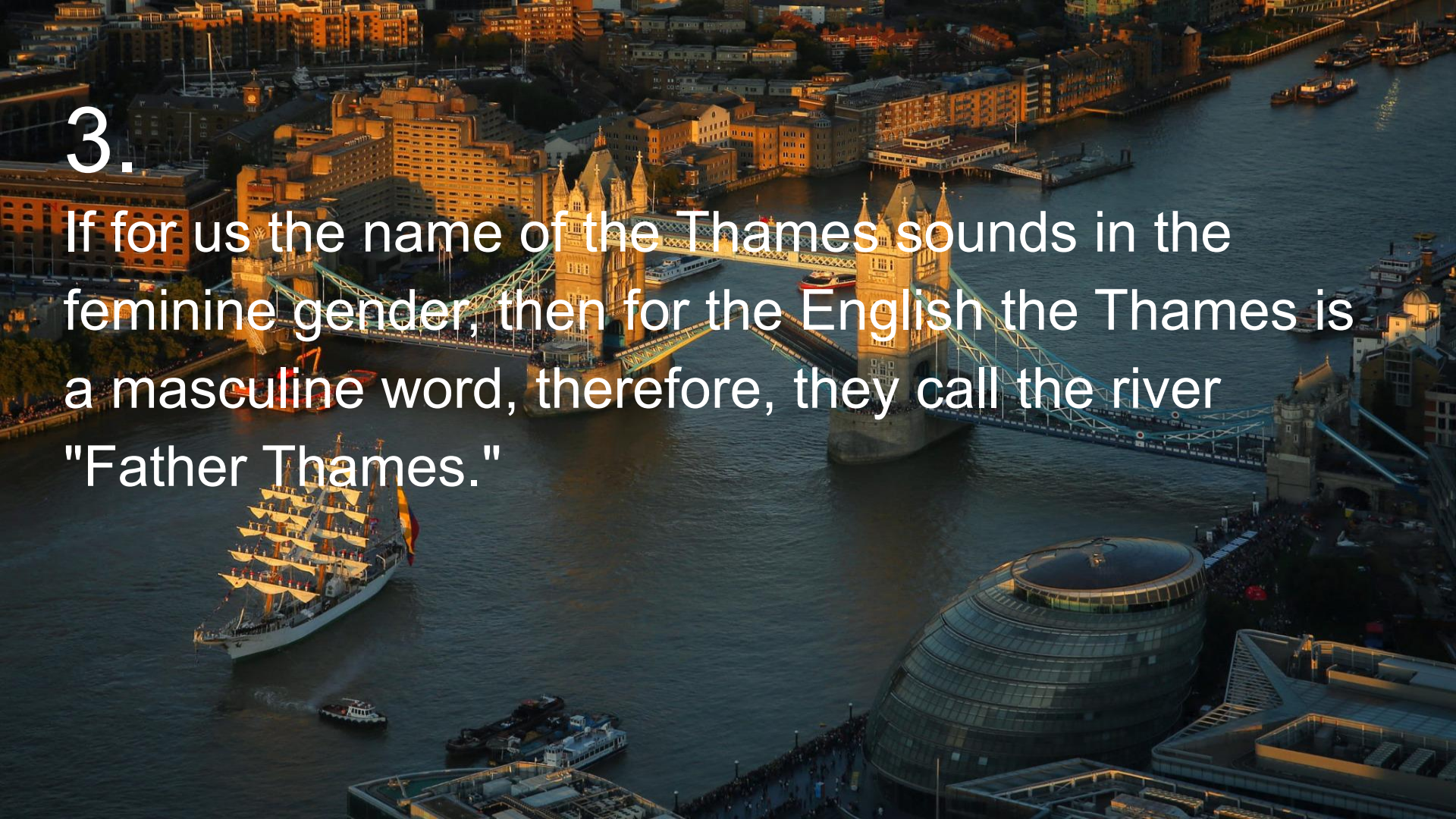
