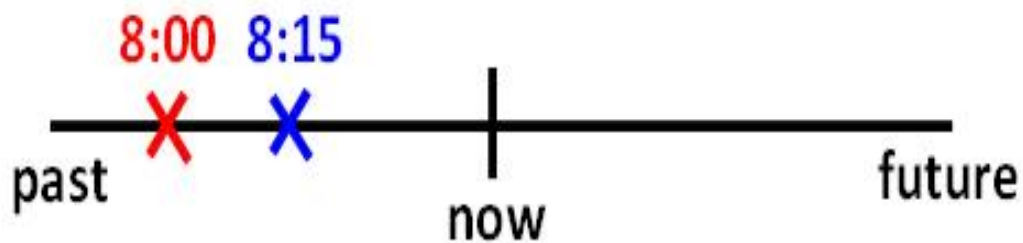

**when we are talking about an event that happened at a particular time in the past**

**For actions that began in the past and continue up to the present (with non-continuous verbs)**

**To talk about specific actions that were in progress around a particular time in the past**

**For recent past events that have a result in the present**

**To talk about recent events, especially when giving some news**

**For actions that happened at unspecific time in the past**

**When we are talking about a sequence of actions in the past**

**To talk about action that happened before a specific time in the past**

**With action verbs to say how long an action or event has been in progress (for..., since...)**

**To describe a scene in the past**
