


Future simple

- о прогнозах и предсказаниях на будущее обычно с выражениями I think, I hope, I believe, I expect; наречиями probably и perhaps.
 I expect he'll be here at 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.
- о сиюминутных решениях:
 This dress is beautiful. I'll buy it.
- об обещаниях (обычно с глаголами promise/swear ит.д.): I promise I won't be late.
- об угрозах: Don't do this again or I'll leave.
- о предупреждениях: Get down from the tree or you'll fall!
- о надежде: I hope I'll see you soon.
- о предложениях: I'll carry the bags for you.
- об информации о будущем действии:




