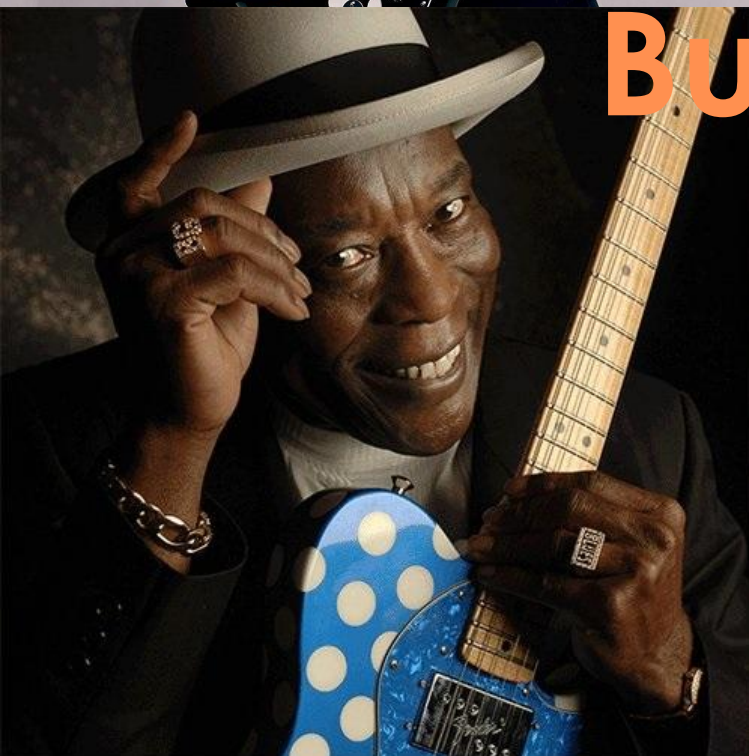
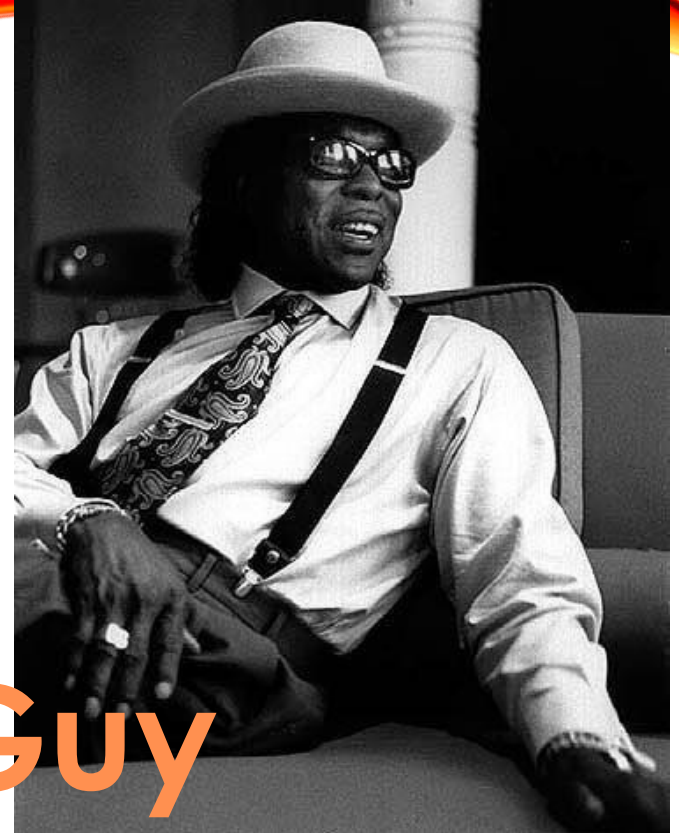

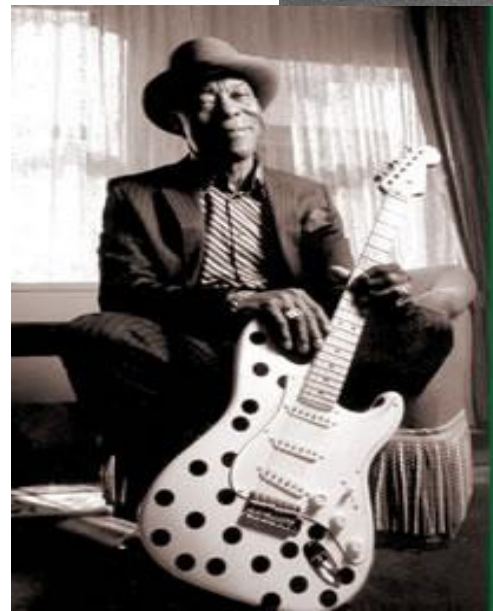
Blues

Blues is a genre and musical form that originated in African-American communities in the "Deep South" of the United States around the end of the 19th century. The genre developed from a fusion of traditional African music and European folk music, that incorporated spirituals, work songs, field hollers, shouts and chants, and rhymed simple narrative ballads.





Buddy Guy

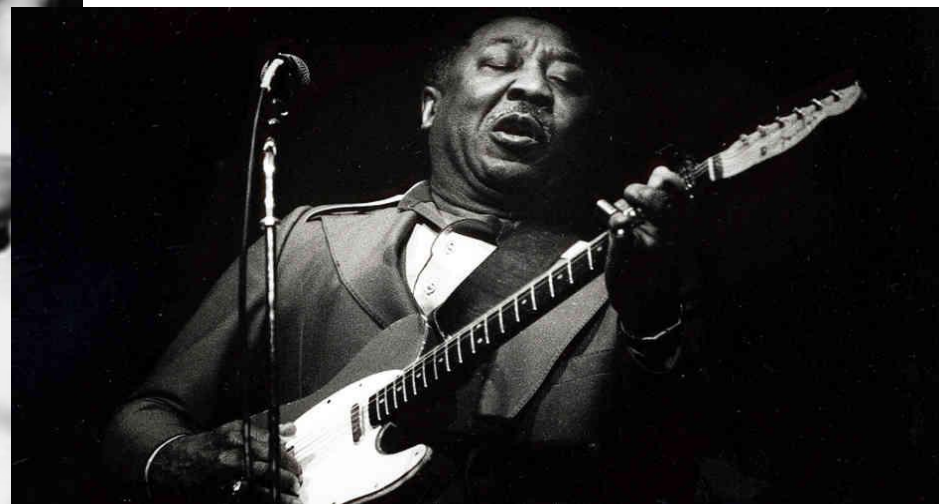

- 5) 2000s – present days.

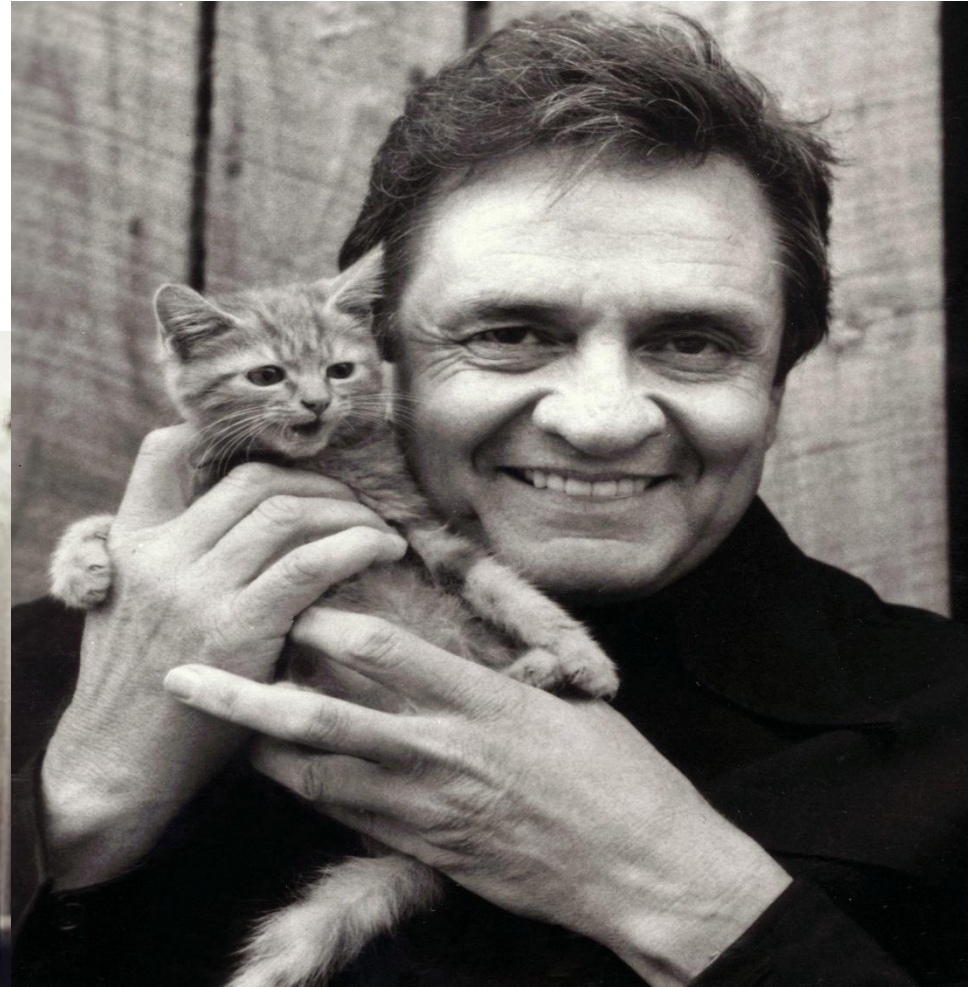




Johnny Cash



Johnny Cash was born in February 26, 1932, in Kingsland, Arkansas. Johnny Cash developed his own individual style of greeting the audience at concerts.



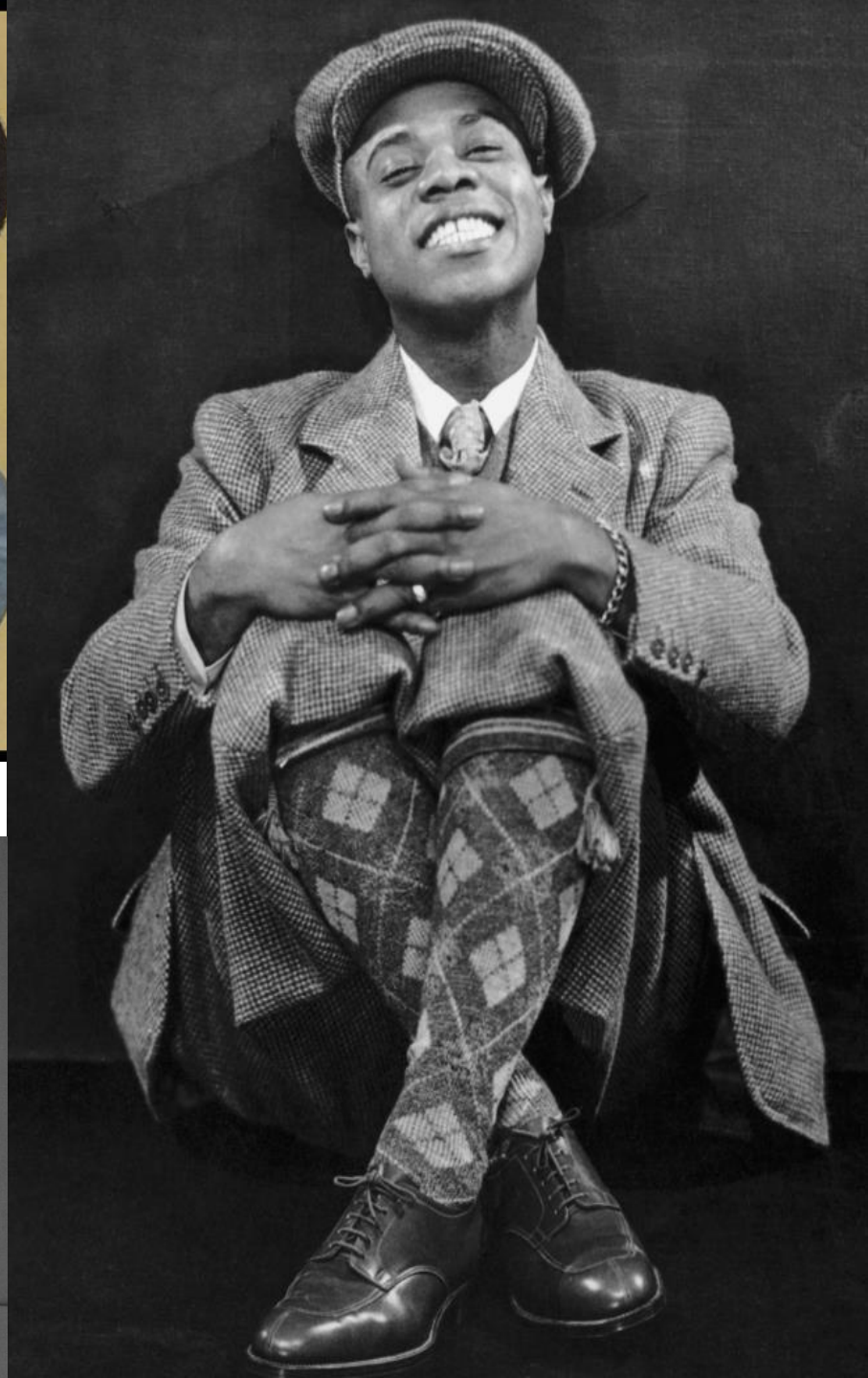
Jazz

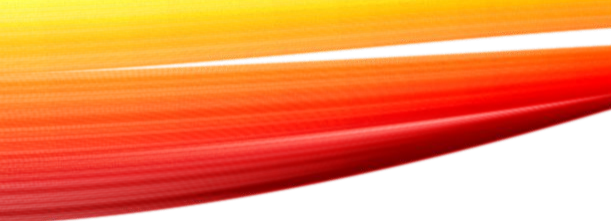


ABBA

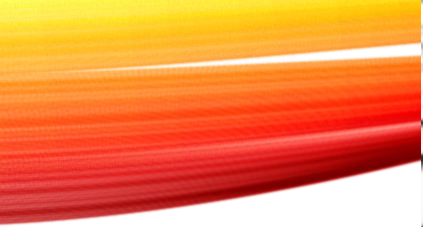


Queen

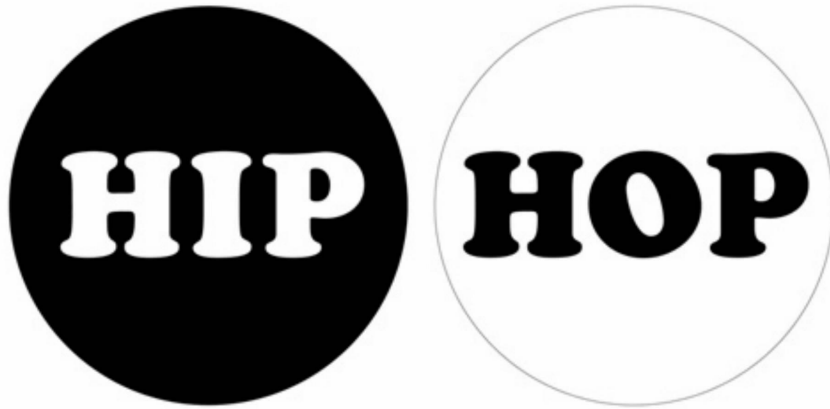

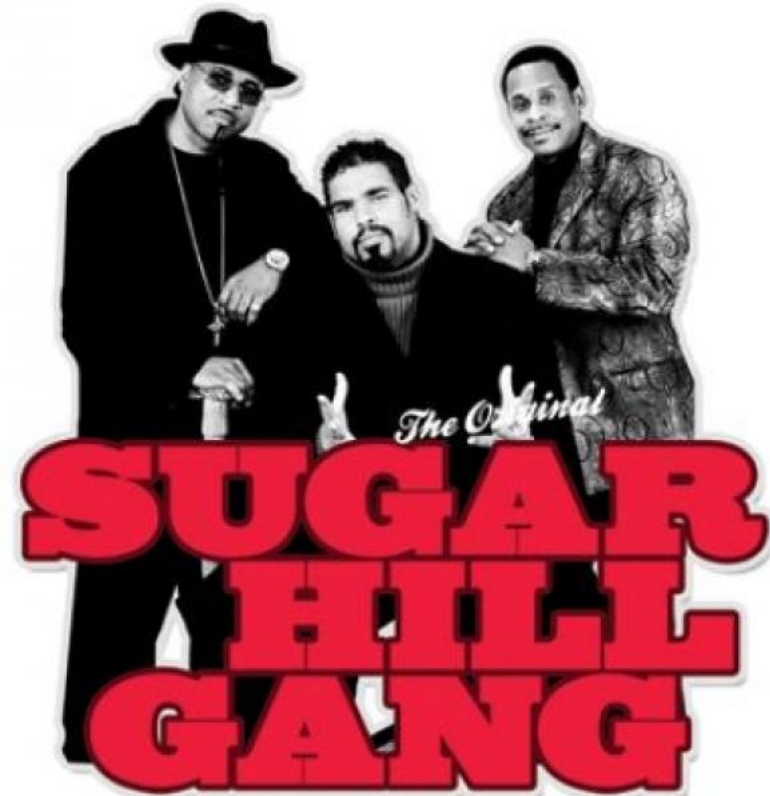


Hip Hop

Hip hop or hip-hop is a cultural movement that formed during the early 1970s among African American and Latino youths residing in the South Bronx in New York City.



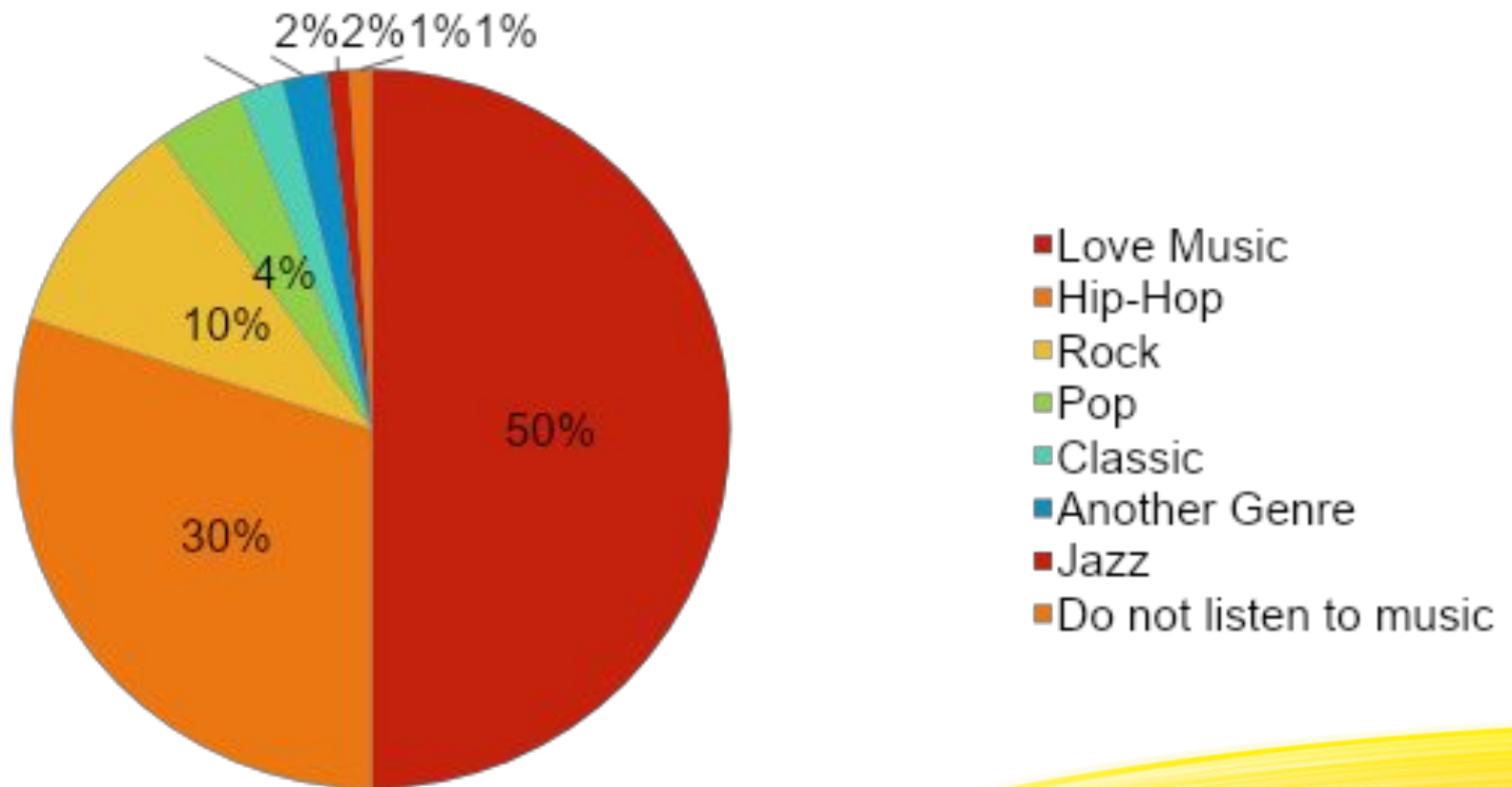
The Sugarhill Gang
