Answer: *We stopped for a while **to
admire** the scenery.*

I hate...(to wait) in queues. It really annoys me.

Answer: *I hate **waiting** in queues. It really annoys me.*

*I can't go on...(to eat) like this -
I'm overweighed.*

Answer: *I can't go on **eating** like this -
I'm overweighed.*

I'm sorry...(to disturb) you, but could you tell me the time?

Answer: *I'm sorry **to disturb** you, but could you tell me the time?*

He dislikes... (to spend) money on the expensive clothes.

*Answer: He dislikes **spending** money on the expensive clothes.*

I remember...(to go) to Venice as a child.

Answer: *I remember **going** to Venice as a child.*

Could you please stop...(to whistle)!
I'm trying...(to concentrate) on my
work.

Answer: Could you please stop
whistling! I'm trying to concentrate on
my work.

He'll never forget ...(to see) the Grand Canyon for the first time.

*Answer: He'll never forget **seeing** the Grand Canyon for the first time.*

Have you tried...(to read) a book to help you to sleep?

*Answer: Have you tried **reading** a book to help you to sleep?*

Did you remember ...(to send) your sister a card? It's her birthday today.

Answer: *Did you remember **to send** your sister a card? It's her birthday today.*
