

## Compare Russia and the UK

## If England was your house, you would:





# you would spend 4 times more money on health care

In per capita terms, public and private spending on health care in the United Kingdom
\$ 2.815 USD, while in Russia - \$ 698 USD.
This indicator combines public, private and corporate health care costs.





#### consumed at 38.91% more oil

□ The British consume 1.1719 a gallon of oil per day per person, while the Russians - 0.8437 a gallon. Calculated from the volume of oil consumed in gallons per day, in terms of population.





#### earned 2.2 times more

GDP per capita in the United Kingdom - \$ 38 940 while in Russia - about \$ 17,700. This measure most economists prefer to use when considering the welfare per capita, when comparing the living conditions and the use of resources in the different countries.





### used at 23.12% less power

□ Electricity consumption per capita in the UK - 5.643 kW, while in Russia - 7,339 kW. This calculation includes the total electricity consumed annually plus imports and minus exports, expressed in kilowatt-hours.



## We lived 13 years longer

Life expectancy at birth in the UK - 79.16, while in Russia - 66.16. This calculation includes the average number of years lived on each group of people born in the same year.







#### We had to 18.75% more free time.

British work on average 1638 hours per year, while in Russian work on average 2016 hours. This calculation is based on the total number of hours worked per year and the average number of people in employment.





# We had on 10.11% increase employability.

☐ In the UK, the unemployment rate - 8.00%, while in Russia - 8.90%.







### Comparing Russian and UK prices

- Prices in the UK by 36% higher than in Russia;
- Rental housing in the UK is 15% more expensive than in Russia;
- Food in the UK by 58% more expensive than in Russia;
- Cafes and restaurants in the UK is 17% more expensive than in Russia;
- Prices in view of rental housing in the UK is 27% higher than in Russia;
- The purchasing power of the population in the UK to 107% higher than in Russia;
- Salaries in the UK after the deduction of taxes by 114% higher than in Russia.
