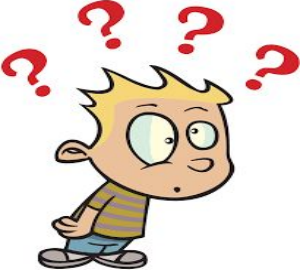




# Santa's hat



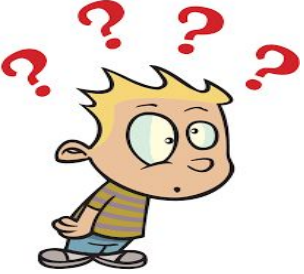
A covering for the head worn by Father Christmas.



# Carols



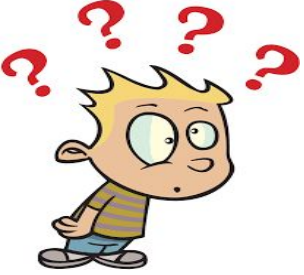
Happy or religious songs, usually sung at Christmas.



# Fireplace



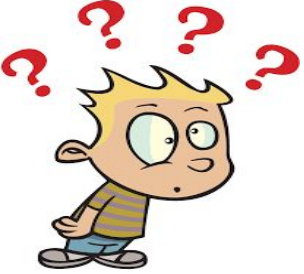
A space in the wall of a room for a fire to burn in, or the decorated part that surrounds this space.



# Angel



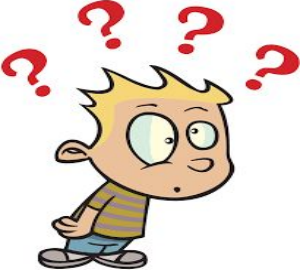
A spiritual being in some religions who is believed to be a messenger of God, usually represented as having a human form with wings.



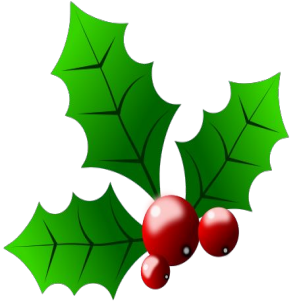
# Snowman

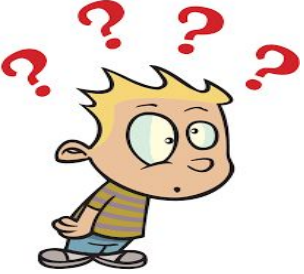


# Holly



A small evergreen tree with shiny, sharp leaves and small, round, red fruit.

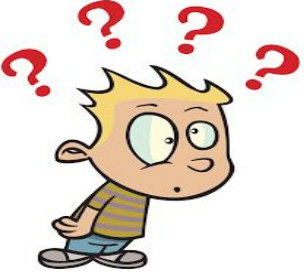




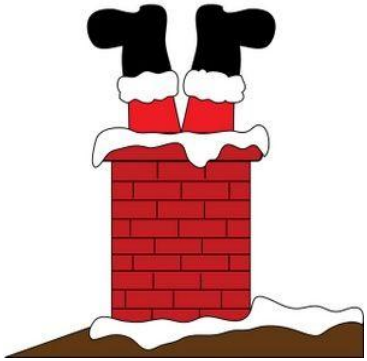
# Reindeer



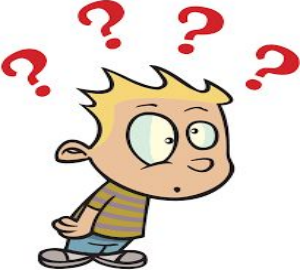
Animal with large horns that lives in the northern parts of Europe, Asia, and North America.



# Chimney



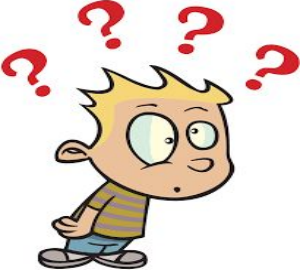
A hollow structure that allows the smoke from a fire inside a building to escape to the air outside.



# Stocking

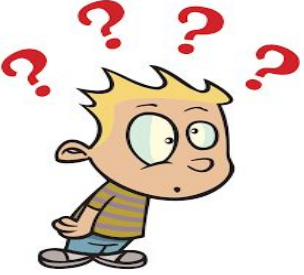


A large sock that children leave out when they go to bed the night before Christmas so that it can be filled with presents.

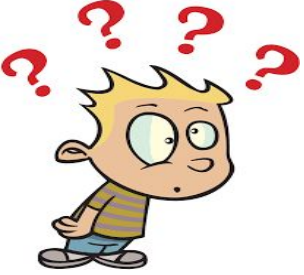




# Bell



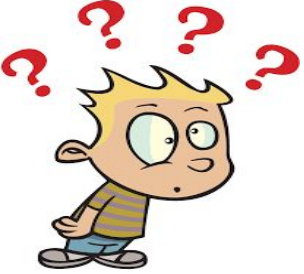
A hollow metal object shaped like a cup that makes a ringing sound when hit by something hard.



# Sleigh



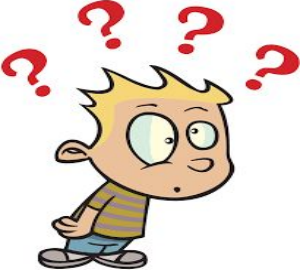
A type of sledge pulled by animals, especially horses, dogs or reindeer.

stories.

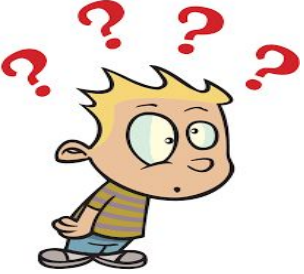

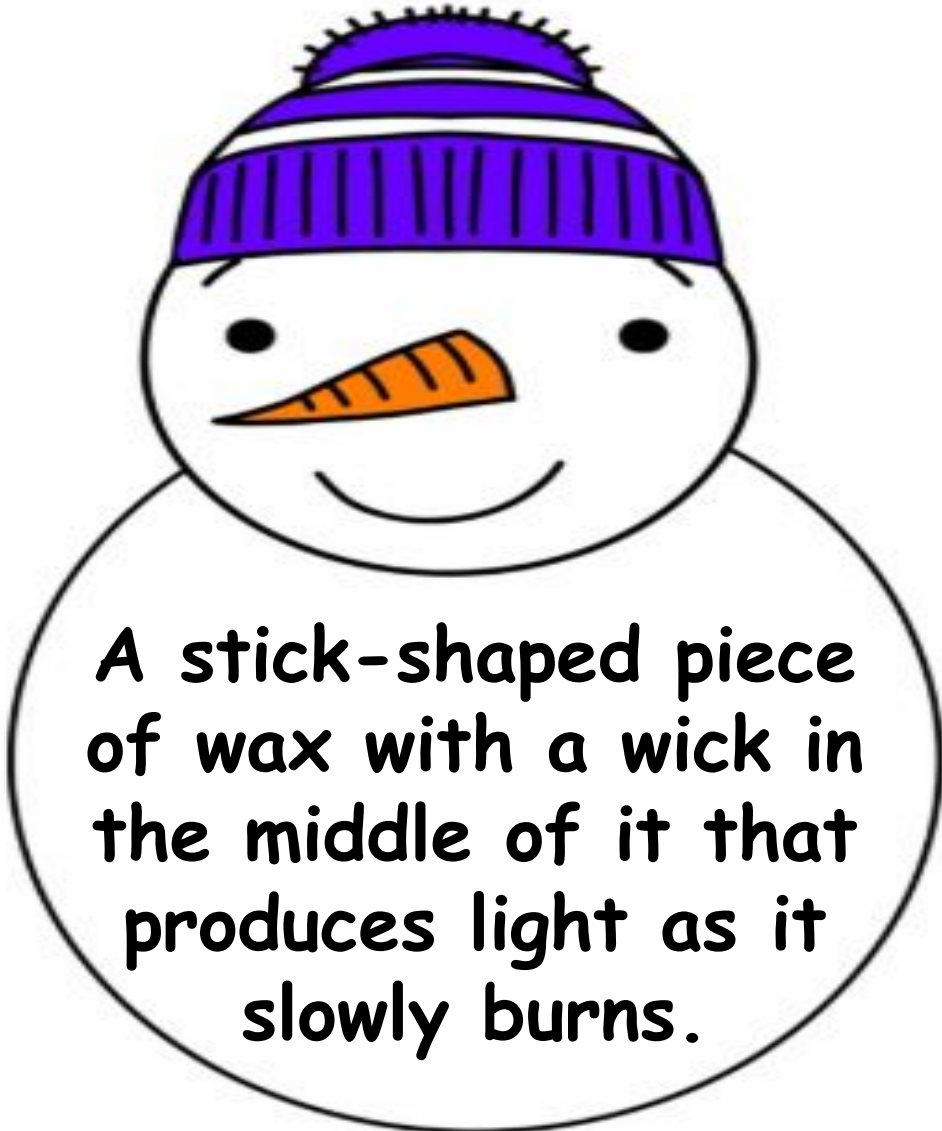


A very large ball of burning gas in space that is usually seen from the earth as a point of light in the sky at night.

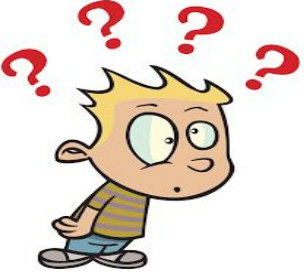




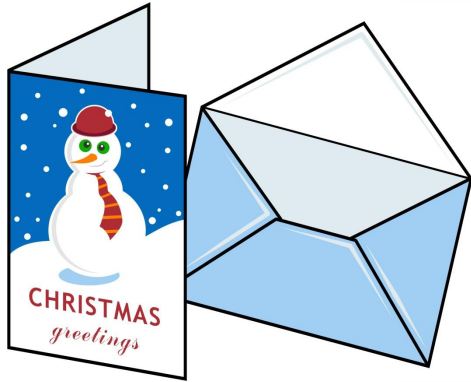
# Candle



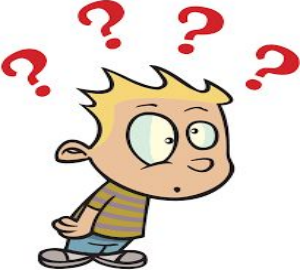
A stick-shaped piece of wax with a wick in the middle of it that produces light as it slowly burns.



# Christmas card



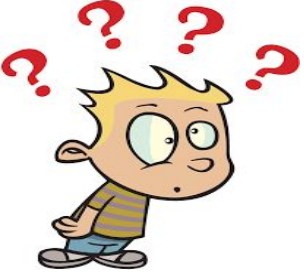
A rectangular piece of stiff paper, folded in half, with a picture on the front and often a message printed inside, sent at Christmas.



# Garland



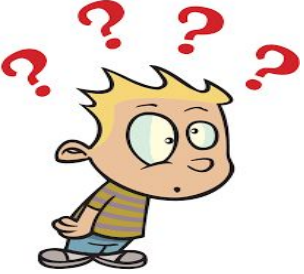
Festoon of flowers,

# Poinsettia



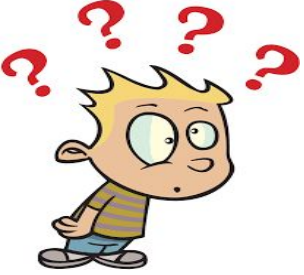
A tropical plant with groups of bright red leaves that look like flowers.



# Christmas tree

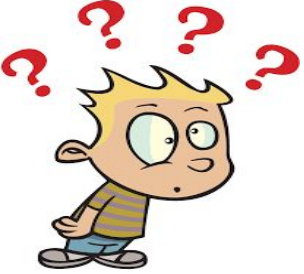


A real or artificial

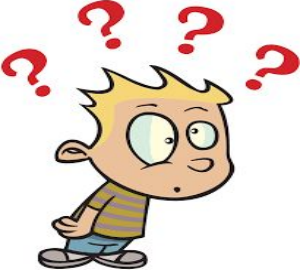

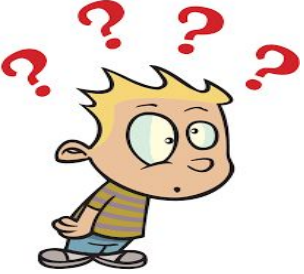
A ring made of flowers and leaves or evergreens used as Christmas decoration.



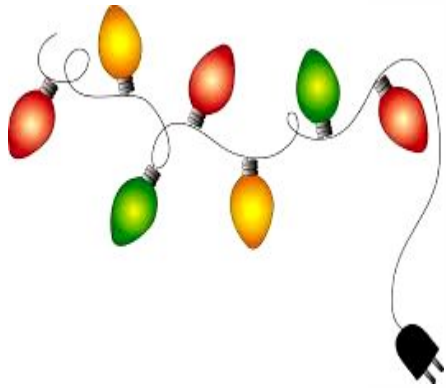

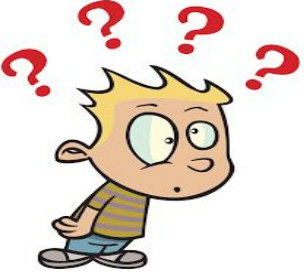

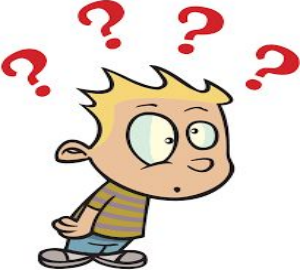
Lamps or bulbs that produce brightness which are used as Christmas decorations.



# Candy cane



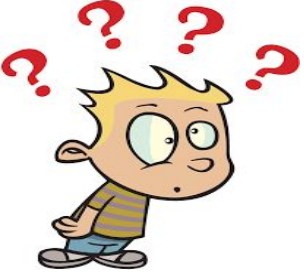
A piece of flavoured

like a walking stick.



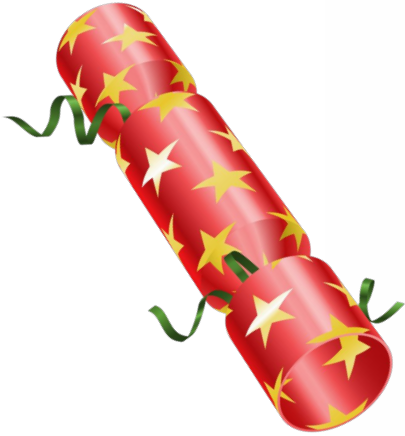
# Santa Claus



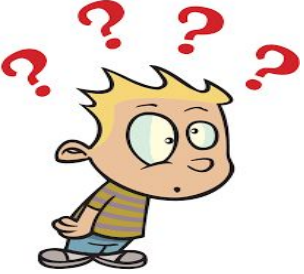
The imaginary old man with long, white hair and a beard and a red coat who is believed by children to bring them presents at Christmas, or a person who dresses as this character for children.



# Cracker



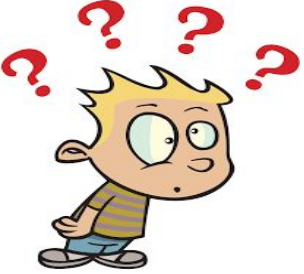
A paper tube with small toys, small pieces of sweet food, etc. inside, which is covered with bright paper and makes a short, sharp sound when both ends are pulled.



# Snowflake



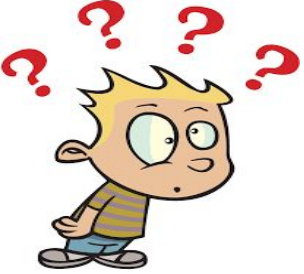
A small piece

sky.



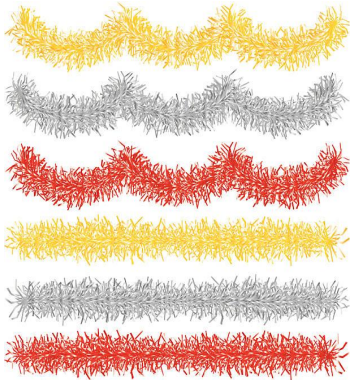
# Christmas pudding



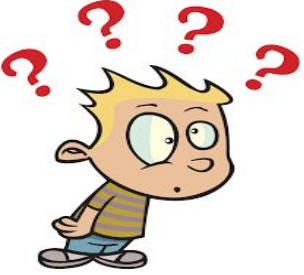
A sweet, dark food containing dried fruit, eaten at the end of the meal in some countries at Christmas.



# Tinsel



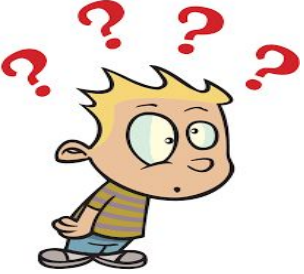
Long pieces of thin, shiny material used as decoration, especially at Christmas.

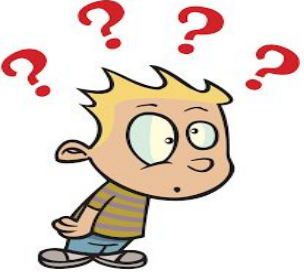




# Advent calendar



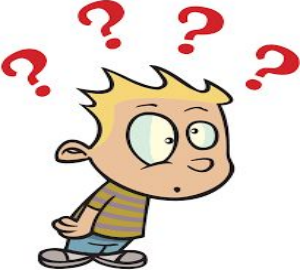

# Baby Jesus



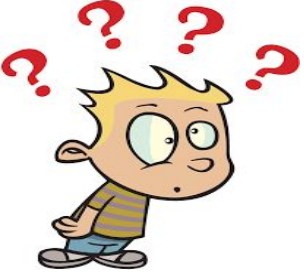
The holy child,

# Carolers



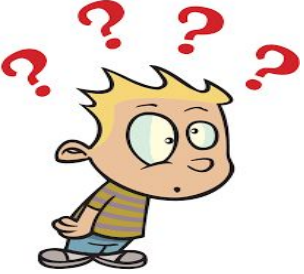
Members of a group of people who go from house to house singing carols at Christmas.

A set of figures displayed at Christmas as an artistic representation of the birth of Jesus Christ.

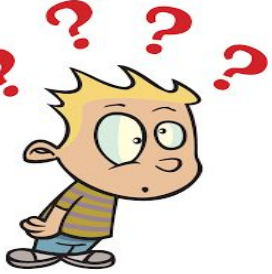


# The Three Wise Men



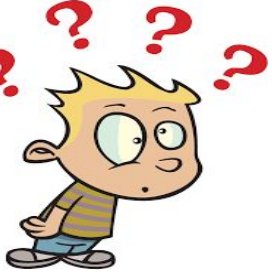
In the Bible, the three men, thought to be kings or astrologers, who followed a star to visit Jesus Christ when he was a baby and gave him presents.

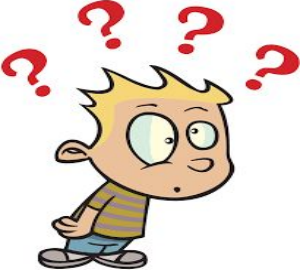

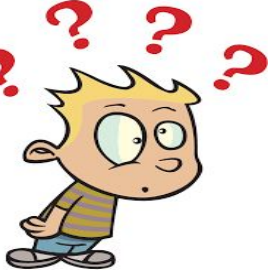
# Coal



A hard, black substance that is dug from the earth in pieces, and can be burned to produce heat or power.

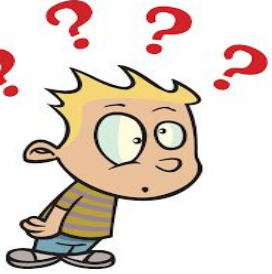

# The Grinch



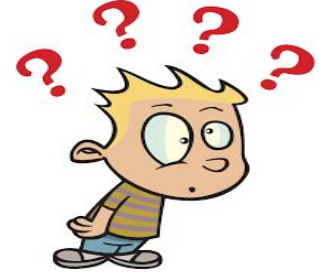
A character in a story by Dr Seuss, who hates Christmas and tries to spoil it for others.

A person whose job is to take care of sheep and move them from one place to another.

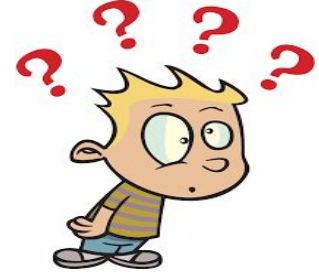
