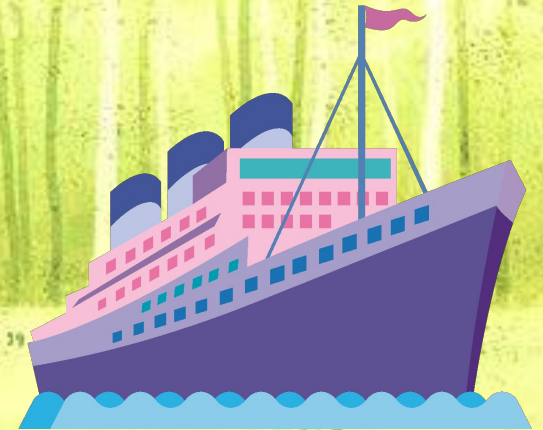

either.....or

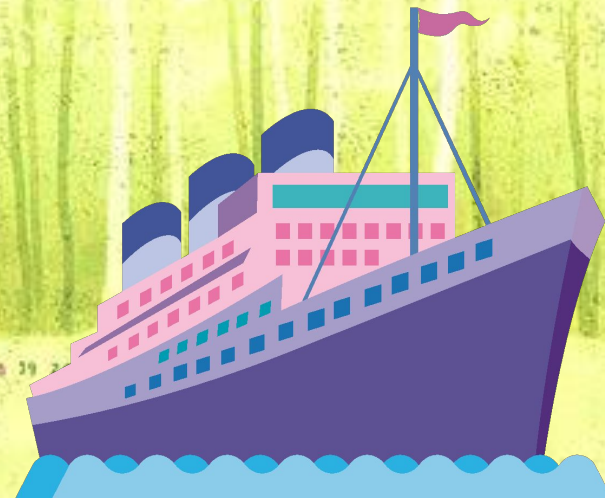
We can use “either.....or” to offer a choice between two things.

E.g. Peter wants to eat some fruit. However, there are only some oranges and some apples in the fridge.

Peter: Mum, I want to eat some fruit.

Mum: Mm... but there are only oranges and apples in the fridge. You may eat either an apple or an orange.

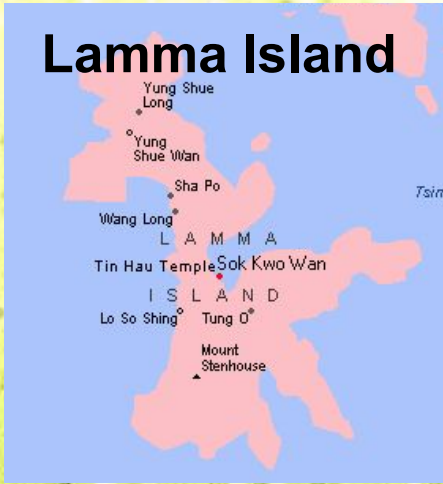
- Now, Lucy and Amy are planning a boat trip.

We can meet at **either** the MTR Station **or** the pier.

When do we return?

We can take **either** the 6:30 ferry **or** the 7:00 ferry.

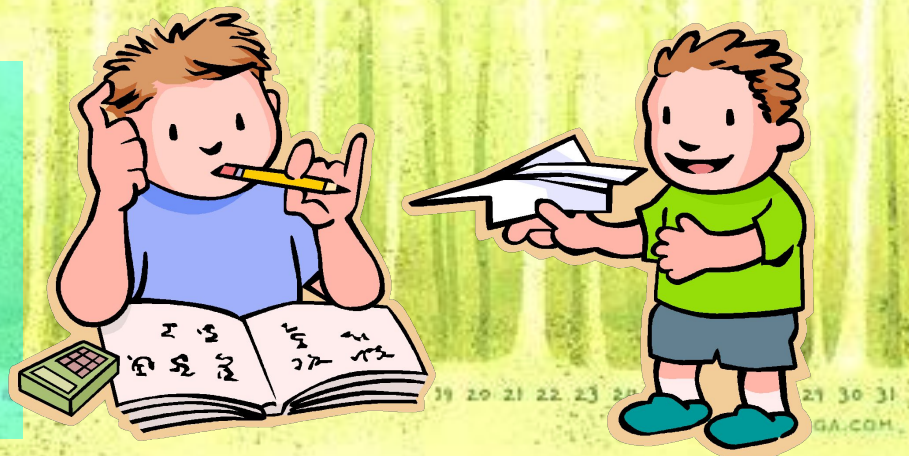
Let's return at 6:30 since

neither.....nor

We can use “neither.....nor” to show two things that are not true or possible.

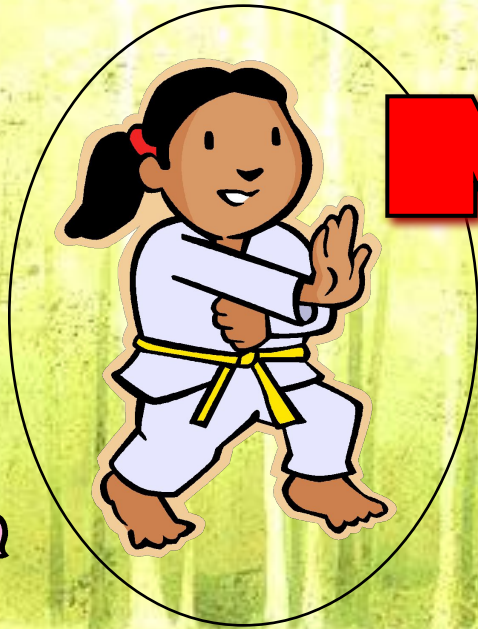
E.g. David wants to have some snacks however he has a bad cold!

David: Mum, I want to have some snacks.

Mum: Snacks? Sorry David. You have a serious illness. You can have **neither soft drinks **nor** fried food.**

Will Sandy and Cindy join the outing?

Neither Sandy nor Cindy will join the outing.

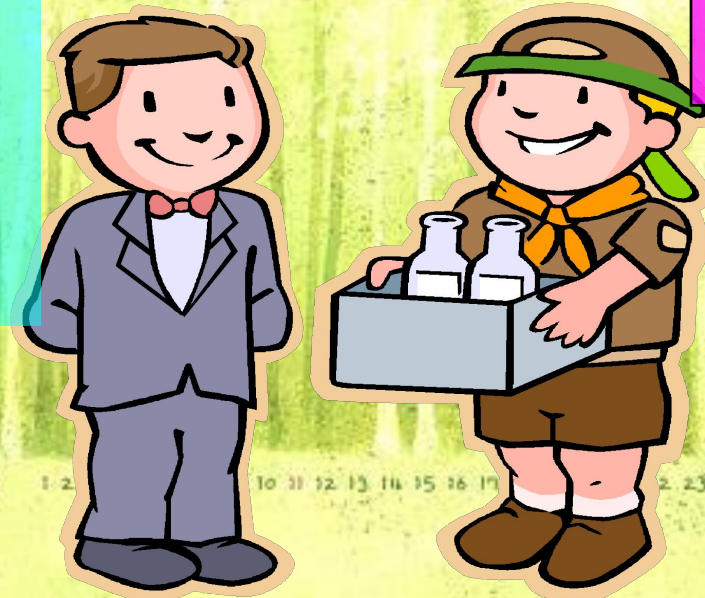


Can I send the form by fax or via mail?
