

Reported Speech


She said: « I'm going to Paris soon »

She asked me where I was going.




w Do you want to go out for a meal? »

He said: « Can I use your phone? »




He asked me if he could use my phone.



When do you have to go to work? »




She asked me when I had to go to work.

She asked Tom to do her a favour.








My wife reminded me to post the letter.

The judge ordered Edward Fox to pay a fine of £100.




Betty persuaded Jane to buy the red dress.


