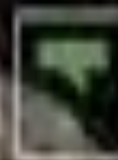



The bubonic plague or “Black Death”



The bubonic **plague** killed almost 33 percent of the population of Europe when it struck between 1347 and 1350. It also affected millions in Asia and North Africa.

In 1876 to 1879, China recorded the deadliest(самую страшную) drought in history. Over nine million people died.
